WORLD WIDE TEMPERANCE PLAN

International Congress on Alcoholism Now in Session in London

London, July 17.—This will be a day world, my masters, if the delegates to the International Congress on Alcoholism, who are here in force today, are successful in their project of launching a world's prohibition federation. Plans for the session were completed today by the leaders among the "antis," and contemplate a great religious gathering tomorrow. Organization will be completed on Monday, and Tuesday will mark the beginning of the real work of the congress.

While the congress on alcoholism is supposedly composed of scientists engaged in an unprejudiced investigation of the effects of alcohol upon the human system, the prohibitionists of the world have made plans to capture the coming conference and turn it into a temperance organization.

Sixteen foreign governments and many British colonies have sent delegates to the congress. Dr. Victor A. Ellsworth, of Boston, is the official representative of the United States. Dr. Frank A. Pleatwell, of the United States navy, will also engage in the discussions. The temperance wing of the congress has Dr. Wilbur Crafts, the Washington reformer, Cora Stoddard, of Boston, as the American delegates. Many other Americans will listen to the addresses, which will cover every phase of alcoholism.

His Royal Highness, the Duke of Connaught, is to be honorary president of the congress and will preside at some of the meetings. Among the honorary vice presidents are the Lord High Chancellor, the Archbishops of Canterbury, York and Westminster; Lord Chief Justice Silverton; Lady Henry Somerset, the Dukes of Pife, Hamilton and Sutherland; Lord Curzon, of Kedleston; Admiral Lord Charles Beresford; Generals Lord Methuen, Ian Hamilton and Chevelme; Field Marshal Lord Grenfell and Sir George White, the bishops of London, Peterboro, Hereford, St. Albans, Southwark, Birmingham, Liverpool, Crovdon and Kensington; Right Hon. John Burns, D. Lloyd George, Thomas Burt, Walter Buchanan, and a hundred or more noble lords and ladies who have achieved fame in various lines of life.

OBSERVE SANTIAGO DAY AT CAPITAL

Spanish War Veterans Hold Annual Celebration Today

Washington, July 17.—Spanish war veterans celebrated today, with a program of patriotic exercises and addresses, the tenth anniversary of the assumption of control over Santiago de Cuba by the American government. It was this date, July 17, 1899, that marked the successful culmination of the Santiago campaign.

When the American troops took charge of that portion of the province of Santiago included in the surrendered territory industries were at a standstill, dire poverty was prevalent, and the people were on the verge of a famine. The estates, almost without exception, had been destroyed, and foodstuffs of all kinds were scarce. The inhabitants of Santiago kept body and soul together with the greatest difficulty, and many succumbed to disease and famine.

American occupation almost immediately resulted in a change for the better. Under the protection of Uncle Sam the people returned to work. Food, medicines and clothing were issued to all in need. Within a short time order was brought out of the prevailing chaos. Today, ten years after the American occupation, the city and province of Santiago are more prosperous than ever before. A sanitary system inaugurated by Americans has brought to a state of perfection, and the city, once a plague spot of contamination, is one of the most healthful in the West Indies.

WAR DEPARTMENT FAVORS OREGON UNIFORMS ACT

Washington, July 16.—The war department has published as a circular and distributed to the various offices and bureaus in the department a recent act of the state legislature of Oregon, prohibiting the wearing of uniforms of the United States army or navy or National Guard, and providing a penalty for violation of this law. The act of the Oregon legislature is very acceptable to the war department, the officers of which are very anxious to have similar legislation enacted by all of the states, so that the unlawful wearing of uniforms of the United States army may be prohibited generally.
