LUNDFALL DROWNED BECAUSE OF COLLISION OF STEAMER AND LAUNCH

Former Eugene Man Meets Death in Portland—Another Body Found

Growsome evidence of an untold tragedy of the waterfront was brought to light yesterday afternoon when Hugh Brady, the veteran diver, feeling about him for the body of Peter Lundfall in seven fathoms of water off the Ash street dock, brought to the surface a piece of human flesh from another body that lay buried and held down by the river sands, says the Oregonian.

Soon afterwards the diver recovered the corpse of Lundfall a short distance from the spot where the other body was lying. But though the latter went down several times, Brady's efforts to again locate the first body was unavailing. The diver told Captain Speler, Harbor-master who stood by in his launch to render assistance, that there was no doubt that some person had been drowned in the river there, and instead of rising to the surface after nine days as usually happens, the body had been weighted down by the drifting sand and silt. By some strange trick of fate, Lundfall was drowned and sank to almost the same place.

The piece of flesh brought up by Brady evidently came from a body that had been in the water for several months. Brady and Captain Speler will try to recover it today. Lundfall was drowned in a collision between the steamer Hustler and a launch owned by Gus Dawson. When he was brought up by Brady, Lundfall had a beer bottle opener tightly clutched in one hand. Coroner Norden will not hold an inquest. Members of the Eugene Lodge, No. 275, of the Eagles have sent word that they will arrange for his funeral services and burial.

Collector of Customs Malcolm yesterday exonerated Captain Campbell of the Hustler from any blame for the accident, and fined Dawson, the launch owner, \$200 for being on the river after sunset with his lights not lit, as the pilot laws require. Dawson had a hearing before the Collector at 10 o'clock in the morning and admitted that his lights were not lit when the accident occurred. Under the laws, the launch itself is seized and held by the collector until the fine is paid, regardless of who the owner may be.
