The dates for the fair this year are Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, September 21, 22 and 23. It was decided to hold the fair in mid-week on account of the fairs that would conflict on earlier or later dates.

Two large additions will be made to the main exhibit building.

This section is to be represented in the East and Middle West this fall at the Iowa state fair, the Nebraska state fair and the Minnesota state fair, the fat stock show in Chicago, also at the corn show at Omaha in November.

There the exhibits will be made ready for shipment and turned over to the agent at Cottage Grove. Then they will be taken entire charge of by the Harriman system, which will put them on exhibition.
