Saturday, July 31, 1909, for the purpose of constructing a fifteen-mile transmission line from the city of Eugene's hydro-electric plant on the McKenzie river.

Bid shall also include handling line material from Southern Pacific Railway Company's yards in Springfield, Oregon.
