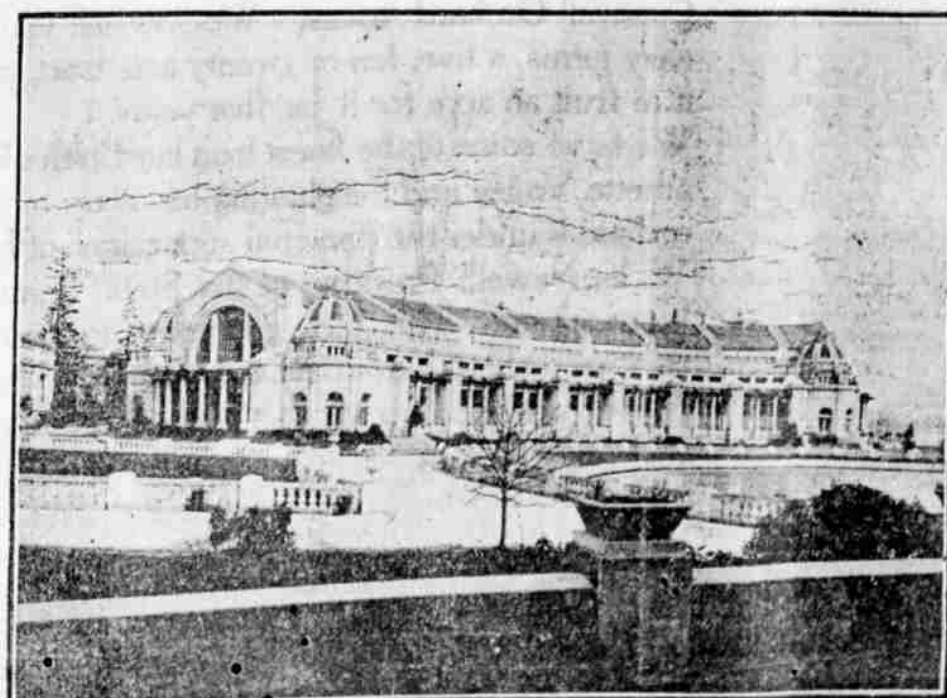

MANUFACTURES BUILDING, ALASKA-YUKON-PACIFIC EXPOSITION.

On the eastern side of Geyser basin at the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition the handsome Manufactures building looks across the restless waters of the cascades and the flashing foam of Old Faithful, the reproduction of its namesake in Yellowstone National park. Its location is the most central of any of the exposition buildings, and its architectural design is especially fitting for the position it has been given. It was one of the first great exhibition palaces to be completed and before the end of last year was ready for the reception of the vast collection of exhibits from the workshops of every nation of importance in the world. It overlooks the finest of the formal gardens of the exposition, and its splendid pergolas, with their vine covered columns and blossoming flowers, complete a beautiful and pleasing view.
