CORVALLIS BAPER KNOCKS OREGON EXHIBIT
Asserts That It Does Not Compare With That of Canada or California

The editor of the Eugene Guard, who was at the Seattle exposition last week, assures his readers that Oregon has the best exhibit on the grounds, that the Kiser photographs of Eugene attract a great deal of attention and that the Seattle Times did Eugene a great service in presenting on its front page a picture of the ten young ladies sent to Seattle by the Guard.
The Guard may be right, but the editor of the Gazette-Times found the Oregon exhibit less attractive than that of Washington, California and Canada. The Oregon building is a superb structure, but the Oregon exhibit lacks much of being as good as Oregon can produce, and it lacks much of being displayed to the best advantage. Less money in the building, more in the exhibit, and a more artistic arrangement would have produced more satisfactory results. That pyramid of apples in the center of the building, and half-moon rousing of fruit about it, would be a joke if it were not serious. The finishing touches to the exhibit as a whole looks like it had been shoveled into place rather than arranged to the best effect. The Oregon exhibit is not discreditably in any sense, and many people express hearty appreciation of what they see there, but in absolute truth there is none of that magnificent impressiveness that one finds in some of the other buildings, and a better display of products could have been secured by people thoroughly onto their job.
Kiser Pictures a Joke.
The Kiser pictures of Eugene, with which the Guard is pleased, are very pretty, but the writer did not see anyone looking at them during his half-dozen visits to that portion of the building. The pictures are small, are hung high, and though beautifully colored, there is nothing about them, or in their location, that forces them upon the attention of visitors to the building. In fact, pictures at the exposition are not a success. Many of the buildings have quite an array of beautiful photos, but these are passed up by nine out of ten. The Spokane building, in particular, has a fine display of pictures, and in its spacious rest room at that, but even here the pictures receive practically no consideration. The writer has seen three other fairs, found nothing of interest at Seattle, and spent his time in observing matters of this kind. A week's inspection convinced him that he would not spend ten cents for pictures that were not inside of printed literature, shown in a moving picture exhibit, or shown by a lecturer with the ability to hold a crowd.

LOCOMOTIVE BOILER EXPLODES AT MARION
Portland, Or., July 29.—By the explosion of a boiler on a freight train near Marion, 15 miles south of Salem on the Southern Pacific railroad this morning, three trainmen were injured and considerable damage done to the train. The injured men are: Charles M. Hoberg, of 343 Oak street, bruised; W. H. Kane, 435 Ross street, broken rib and bruised; and Walter Davis, 190 Broadway, scalp wound. Hoberg was taken to Good Samaritan hospital and the latter two were sent to their homes in Portland.
The accident was caused by the dropping of the crown-sheet of the boiler, which was followed by the explosion. Superintendent Fields is at a loss to account for the cause of this and is conducting an investigation into the accident. It is believed that some disgruntled former employe of the company or tramps have been tampering with the machinery.

WELCH SENDS RAILS TO CENTRALIA

Centralia, Wash., July 29.—A carload of streetcar rails is in the Northern Pacific freight yards here, and another car is at Chehalis. They are consigned to the Twin City Traction Company, which holds franchises to operate a streetcar system in Centralia and Chehalis and between the two cities.
The arrival of the rails has put new confidence into the streetcar project, which many people in Centralia and Chehalis had begun to fear had gone by the board. The holders of the franchise are A. Welch and W. J. Patterson, of Portland, of Theodore Hoss of Centralia.

COTTAGE GROVE BUYS QUARRY FOR STREETS

Cottage Grove, Or., July 29.—At the last council meeting it was decided to buy the Cochran rock quarry, located one mile north of town, for the purpose of street and road improvement, as this rock is of excellent quality and perfectly adapted for crushing. The quarry contains three acres, and will furnish material for years to come, and is of easy access. A first-class rock crusher and steam roller are soon to be installed and street and road improvement will be begun in earnest. Cottage Grove will soon rank with the first-class towns with model roads.

GERMAN MEASLES HAS BEEN THE SICK FAD
Have You Had Them? Only Makes You Sick for 36 Hours

Have you ever had the measles, the red measles or the German measles? Anyhow, look out, for the German measles have been in town for months and months and may not go away for more months. Because you have had the red measles, the ordinary kind, is no protection from the Dutch variety.
