RAIN KILLED PHEASANTS

July Storm Drowned Pretty Game
Birds Says Henry Mathews.

"Thousands of Chinese pheasants were drowned and died from cold and exposure during the Fourth of July rainstorm," said Henry Mathews, of Goshen, today. "The farmers did not discover the mortality among the splendid game birds until they began to cut their grain fields. I found in one heap seventeen half-grown dead Chinas. In another there were eight. I think that they were drowned not only in the lowlands but on the higher fields, for the heavy rain of the Fourth made the stalks literally run with water." Hunting pheasants is prohibited by law now. If it wasn't for the continuous closed season the pretty game birds might be exterminated soon.

Rankin went out, but Hanns knocked a pretty two-bagger that drove in a tally. The score was 8 to 7. Pitcher Morris, however, failed to hit hard and the game ended with one.

SAVE THE BEAUTIFUL CEDAR TREES IN THE COUNTY PARK

The beautiful cedar trees in the west county park seem to be gradually dying, many of the needles turning brown during the summer. E. J. Crow, who perhaps takes more interest in the park than any other man in town, says the trees are dying for lack of water. Yesterday he dug around the base of several of the trees and irrigated them, being confident that thorough watering every day during the remainder of the summer will save them. Mr. Crow says he thinks the reason the trees are dying is that this year they have not been irrigated at all, whereas in previous years they have been well watered. Even if the water had been turned on during the summer it would have done little good for the reason that the ground around the base of the trees is so badly packed. By loosening the earth around the trees the water will find its way to the roots and will cause the trees to revive.

HARRIMAN WINS

FIRST ROUND IN DESCHUTES CONTEST

Moro, Or., Aug. 2.—By resorting to the court, the Deschutes Railroad Company, as the Harriman extension into Eastern Oregon is officially known, has recovered use, temporarily at least, of the wagon road to the brink of the river canyon, blocked last Monday by Porter Bros. This has been accomplished by securing an injunction restraining Porter Bros. from interfering with the passage by Twohy Bros' employees or freight teams over the highway across the three ranches on which Porter Bros. have obtained options, and on one of which they have locked the gate across the road.
