BIRTHS EXCEED DEATHS BY NINE DURING JULY

Only Four Cases of Contagious Disease Reported—Little Illness

During the month of July the births exceeded the deaths in Lane county by nine, despite the fact that Lane county boosters claim that many people come to this equable climate to spend their last days. The births numbered 34, 17 girl and 17 boy children. The deaths were 25, 13 female and 12 male.

The causes of death were: Uremic poisoning 2; pulmonary tuberculosis 2; suicide 2; typhoid 1; valvular heart disease 2; typhoid 1; peritonitis 1; influenza 1; auto-infection 1; diabetes 1; cancer of stomach 1; nephritis 1; Bright's disease 1; old age 1; accidental drowning 1; tuberculosis of the bowels 1; endocarditis 1; carcinoma of the kidney 1; rickets 1; puerperal eclampsia 1; and purulent cystitis 1.

The physicians over Lane county reported only four cases of contagious disease, one each of smallpox, scarlet fever, diphtheria, and typhoid.

In speaking of the health condition of Lane county, County Health Officer J. W. Harris emphasized the fact that there seems to be little sickness. "So far as I can learn the doctors have not much to do," said he.

He agrees with many others that when 1000 or 2000 men are living in camps along the Willamette building the Naiton extension that care will be taken to exercise by towns along the river. "The water of the river is likely to become infected, for in railroad camps there are always many cases of disease," was one of his statements.

COUNTY BOUNDARY

LINES TO BE SET

Linn and Lane Counties Want to Know Just Where They Meet

Albany, Or., Aug. 5.—The boundary line established by the State Legislature in 1907 between Linn and Lane counties will be surveyed during the coming two weeks. The line was changed materially by the 1907 legislature by agreement of the two counties, and has never been surveyed or definitely established. Considerable trouble on this account has been caused the assessors of the two counties and property owners living adjoining the new line.

The line will be surveyed by County Surveyor A. L. Geddes, of Linn county, and C. M. Collier of Lane county. Geddes will leave Albany tomorrow with a crew and the survey will probably begin Monday. It is the intention of the two surveyors to begin at Blue River and survey westward.
