OREGON ELECTRIC COMING THIS WAY

Edward P. Smith, Representing Bond Department of Oregon Electric, Tours the Road.

Portland, Aug. 6.—Edward P. Smith, of New York, representing the stock and bond holders of the Oregon Electric Railroad Company, is today making an inspection trip of the Portland-Salem line of that road, in company with General Manager Guy W. Talbot, and it is reported that the expenditure of \$2,000,000 for extensions of the electric system which was considered early in the summer has practically been decided upon.

President Moffat and a number of the directors of the Oregon Electric were in Portland several months ago and considered the appropriation of enough money to extend the line to Albany at that time. Action on this was postponed until later in the year then, but the talk of extension has been revived by the visit of Mr. Smith.

There can be no doubt but that the ultimate intention of the builders of the Oregon Electric is to connect their Willamette Valley line down through Eugene and into Southern Oregon. There have also been rumors of the extension of the Forest Grove branch westward toward the coast, but plans in that direction have not reached the stage that those for the Southern Oregon extension have attained. It is considered highly probable that the Salem line will be extended to Albany at least during the coming year.
