### MARK TWAIN'S SUNDAY THEATRE CAUSES UPROAR

New York, Aug. 7.—The Women's Society for the Prevention of Incontinent Amusement on the First Day of the Week have gained another glorious victory.

When Mark Twain and other Godless folks who ought to be roasting in hades this minute, organized an educational theatre, you may well imagine that all us good and pious people held up our prayer books in holy horror and sanctified alarm. ### NEW RAILROAD BROWNSVILLE TO MOUNTAINS

An east and west line across Oregon, which has been the wish of Central Oregon people for years, has received another boost through the incorporation of what is called the Central Oregon & Pacific Railroad Company, at Salem, with a capital of \$50,000. Franklin T. Griffith, attorney for the company, states that the intention is to begin construction eastward from Brownsville, on the east side line of the Southern Pacific, at once.

Charles H. Warner is in the vicinity of Albany today. The proposed road is to run from Albany to Ontario, on the O. R. & N. in Eastern Oregon.

"I cannot say who is behind the company, excepting that of course our present directors are dummies," said Mr. Griffith. "But we have funds with which to do the work and hope to begin construction eastward from Brownsville by fall.

The three men named in the directorate are Franklin T. Griffith, Dorsey B. Smith and Charles H. Warner. Griffith has handled the railroad end of the Portland Railway, Light & Power Co's. legal business for some years. Smith was formerly assistant superintendent of the O. R. & N. Co. and is now general manager of the Open River Transportation Company, a company in close sympathy with a project for a railroad from Ontario to Coos Bay.—Journal.

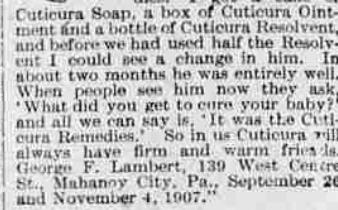
