NEWS OF BUSY SPRINGFIELD

SPRINGFIELD RATE INCREASE IS GREAT

"Business at the Southern Pacific depot at Springfield shows a great increase over any previous month," said S. P. Agent C. B. Orton yesterday. "The total number of pounds was 37,000,000 and the cash remitted from the local office amounts to \$6,795.00. During the month 498 car loads of freight were received and in less than car load lots, \$10,000 pounds." Besides the above mentioned cars, 74 cars have been shipped out which amounts to 764,453 pounds, and less than car load lots forwarded, 26,200 pounds. The Booth-Kelly Company put in an order yesterday for 25 cars. Five cars of outfits arrived yesterday for the contractors up the patron route. Agent Orton has five men working for him in the depot.

Representatives of the Portland, Eugene & Eastern Railway Company will meet the Springfield council Monday night. From statements made by Springfield people the bridge across the Willamette will have to be built this autumn or the franchise in Springfield will be revoked.

McKENZIE HATCHERY HAS 2000 SALMON

"That hatchery up the McKenzie has 2000 salmon behind the fence," said Deputy Fish Warden Will Mack, who visited Springfield this week. He described the work of the hatch-

ery and expressed the belief that it would be a success. Besides inspecting the hatchery the fish warden has investigated the dams throughout Lane county to see if they are built according to law. Warden Mack visited his mother in Eugene while on the trip.

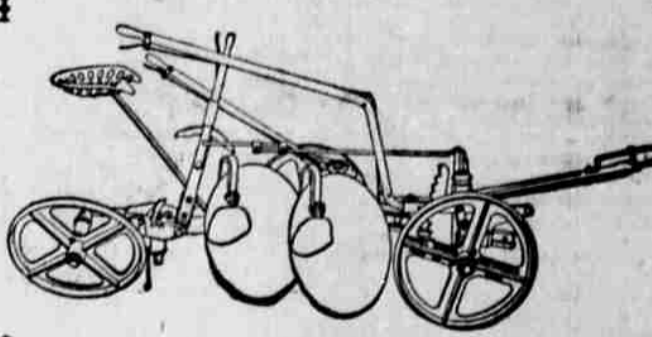
