## FIXED CHARGES OF CITY BEYOND \$25,000 MARK

Also Incidental Expenses of \$12,000—Resources \$26,000, Including Incidentals

The report of the investigating committee of the council last night showed the fixed expenses of the city to be \$25,701, and the resources to be \$26,557. Incidental expenses amount to \$12,000, and there is incidental resource varying each year and each month that cannot well be calculated.

Street contracts were awarded as follows: Grading of East Fifteenth street, to E. F. Judkins, at 38c a yard; Emerald avenue to same at 37c, Fairmount boulevard at 29c.

For the grading of East Fifteenth street from Fairmount boulevard to city limits, contract was awarded to Manerud & Co., at 43 cents per lineal foot of street; grading to be done after manner of Agate avenue. Grading of Emerald avenue to same contractor at 42c for same style of work.

A. C. Mathews was awarded contract for grading alley between Oak, Pearl, Sixth and Seventh streets at \$40, and the grading of the same to Manerud & Co.

**Odds and Ends.**  
The street committee reported that 9856 feet of lumber was used for repairs in July.

The pumping bill for July was \$754.10.

Decayed fruit back of the Seattle Produce Company's wholesale fruit house was reported as a menace to the health of the city.

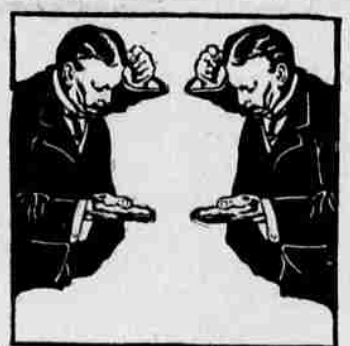
