CAUSE OF RECENT FIRE AT ALBANY

BACON ADMITS HE WAS RECKLESS

Man Who Killed Ferguson for Deer Exonerated by Coroner's Jury

Roseburg, Or., Aug. 12.—Albert Bacon, who last Friday shot and killed M. D. Ferguson while hunting near Elkhead, was acquitted at Yoncalla by the Coroner's jury and a verdict of accidental shooting brought in.

Bacon admitted that it was reckless shooting and that he shot at a spot no bigger than his hand, thinking it was a deer, notwithstanding he had entered into a compact with his companions not to shoot until certain of what he was firing at.
