C. W. SEMMES FIGURES

IN POLICE COURT

Accuses Wife of Infidelity and
Creates a Sensational
Scene

Firm in the belief in the infidelity of his wife, C. W. Semmes, a real estate salesman in the employ of the Brong-Steele Company, of 110 Second street, created a scene Friday night in a rooming-house at 200 1/2 First street, conducted by Mrs. M. Ryan.

Semmes entered the place shortly before midnight, and declaring that his wife was in one of the rooms, demanded of the landlady that he be allowed to search the house. When the woman refused, the man grew furious and drawing a loaded revolver from his pocket, threatened to kill her. Roomers in the house, hearing the disturbance, telephoned for the police, and Patrolman Madden disarmed Semmes and arrested him. He was sent to the city jail, charged with being drunk and carrying concealed weapons. Investigation revealed that Semmes' suspicions of his wife were unfounded, as she was found visiting friends on Clay street, near the scene of her husband's arrest.—Oregonian.

(Semmes is well-known in Eugene, having worked on The Guard and Register as a printer, and in various other capacities. He moved to Portland last spring.)

Chehalis, Wash., Aug. 15.—A force of men started work this week on National street in this city, tearing up the old planks and preparing the way for the steam shovels. The Twin City Light & Traction Company's franchise for an electric line, which is to run to and through Chehalis and Centralia, was about to expire, and it got busy so as to hold its rights. The steam shovels have been ordered, they are being placed along the right-of-way, and three crowds of rails have been unloaded, preparatory to building the interurban. The company expects to be operating cars between the two cities by the latter part of the fall.
