NEWS OF BUSY SPRINGFIELD

PART OF CONSTRUCTION CO.'S MATERIALS ARRIVE

One of Undermen Arrives to Superintend Preliminaries to Begin at Once

H. W. Arnold, representing the Utah Construction Company, came in last evening, and several carloads of construction materials for the railroad consigned to him arrived at Springfield today.

When seen this morning Mr. Arnold stated that he had but few plans laid out yet, for as a matter of fact his first work will be to lay out plans for the preliminaries that will be necessary to actual construction before any real railroad work is done. Headquarters along the route must be established, wagon roads built and repaired, supplies and materials must be delivered, warehouses located and numerous other preliminaries necessary before the sub-contractors start work.

A story was on the streets this morning that one of the head men of the Utah Construction Company named Rankin was in town. Mr. Arnold said he knew nothing of this man, and did not think there was any man by that name in the company.

Quite a number of men are daily applying for work at the engineers' offices. The engineers have their survey crews already made up. The Utah Construction Co. will open office in Eugene in the course of a few weeks, and until then the few men will be needed.

Several have thought the opening of the railroad camps up the river will be apt to draw men from the sawmills, and an increase of wages will follow. However, experience has shown that this is generally not the case. Railroad construction is hard work and from every camp men will be leaving as well as coming. These men will naturally apply for work in Springfield after leaving the camps.

The sawmill is shipping a good deal of lumber this summer, but as usual, is having difficulty in getting cars. A full day shift is being run. When they can keep up without it a night shift does not pay.

CARMAN GROCERY STORE IS SOLD

Mr. Carman, who has conducted the grocery store next to Hampton's has sold out to I. D. Larimer and a man named Luster from Jasper. These men have both been in this business before, and the store will doubtless be even more popular than before. Mr. Carman has not yet decided what he will do in the future. He will leave Springfield for the time being, but may return.

Considerable fun was had on the street yesterday watching the operation of breaking and shoeing a bunch of broncos to be used on the railroad work. Some of the animals were good-looking horses and others were quite mean.

The flouring mill was stopped for a few hours this forenoon as a result of losing a sheet of cloth in one of the sifting machines. It was hard to get at to repair.

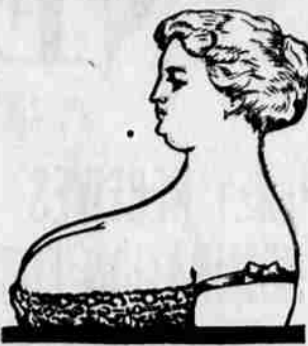
The new 500-kilowatt turbine is being installed in the electric plant and will be running in a few weeks. It is held up through the missing of several parts that had to be sent for. When it is ready one generator will be used actively for power purposes and the other for lights. They are both of the same capacity. They will give all the power necessary for the three street cars.

The big cordwood drive that has been coming down the river and into the Eugene millrace has passed. Over 150 cords have been sent down from a point on the Coast Fork this side of Cottage Grove by a party named Fisher. It is gathered in this mill pond and sold in Eugene.

Esma Bassed, formerly of Springfield, but now an O. A. C. student at Corvallis, is visiting her friends here. Her father, who was the well-known Boss-Kelly foreman here, has a mill of his own near Corvallis.

The real estate men report that since the railroad has begun operations property owners have taken their property off the market, awaiting developments. But few transfers are reported.

Hall & Soleim have some twenty men at work on the new sewer. A car of their pipe has been held up somewhere. A trailer has been sent after it.
