HARRY THAW BADLY TREATED SAYS MOTHER

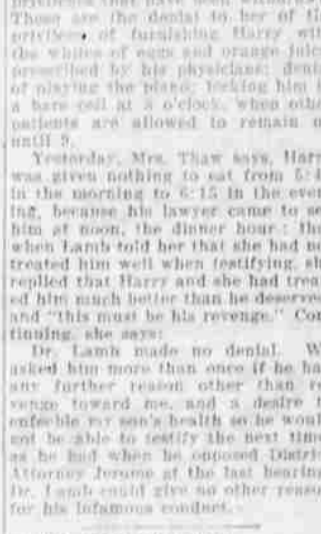
