CONTRACTORS' FAMILIES WILL LIVE IN EUGENE

City's Population Increased by
Arrival of Many From
California

The several members of the Utah Construction Co., who have the contract to build a portion of the Naton-Klamath Falls extension of the Southern Pacific railway, besides the large number of sub-contractors, engineers and under workmen, will make their homes in Eugene during the two years required for the completion of the line and most of them will bring their families here to live. John B. Wallace, A. O. and W. A. Betchell and Clarence Thorne, all of Oroville, Cal., who are sub-contractors, arrived here this morning with their wives and they are looking around today for places to live. Others connected with the construction forces have already brought their families and more are to follow. Some of them will board at hotels while others will rent dwellings, if they can find them, and keep house during the time the work is going on at the front.

Nearly every train from California brings a number of workmen to be employed on the new railroad. The work has only been fairly started and not more than 250 are now employed, but before another month is gone it is stated that 2000 or more men will be working at different points between Naton and the east end of the contract.

Engines and Horses Arrive.
This morning two car loads of horses and one car load of donkey engines arrived in Eugene to be used on the work by the contractors. They were unloaded in Eugene and will be taken to the scene of operations from here. It is not known why the horses and engines were not taken to Naton or Goshen, the nearest points to the scene of operations. It is probable that a great deal of the construction materials and supplies for the men will be sent direct from Eugene.
