SPRINGFIELD AND VICINITY

IMPROVEMENTS AT ELECTRIC PLANT

Frank Burt, foreman of the Willamette Valley Company, had a force of men at work changing the transformers and installing two new ones at the power plant today. The ratio of the old ones is not correct for the new turbines and they are being changed to the 2200-volt instead of 2800 step-up. It is said that when the new turbine is working the voltage will be raised to 10,000. This is so that the present power lines may be used, without stringing new ones for the additional turbine. The same sized wire will carry more current if the voltage is raised. This high voltage, however, will make the line work extremely dangerous.

The new turbine is now held up only by the non-arrival of a 5-inch elbow. The company sent to Portland, then to Seattle, and finally had to send East for it.

Manager J. L. Lambirth, with Ralph Poppleton, of Portland, was in Springfield this morning, visiting the light plant.

Two more wells are about to be put down in addition to the seven already in use for the engines of the light plant. The wells are more reliable than to take water from the mill race.

BOOTH-KELLY

SAWMILL NOTES

The Booth-Kelly sawmill is now getting fifteen cars of logs daily from Wendling. They are hauled to the company's siding and dumped into the pond. There are no drives in the river this year.

The company has several men at work cutting into the hill back of the planer to make more room for piling their lumber. The dirt that is excavated is used to fill in under the docks.

Several hundred feet of fire hose has been received at the mill to replace the present, which is quite rotten. This hose was put in scarcely three months ago, but has been carelessly handled so that the new hose was necessary.

WAGON BRIDGE IS

BEING PAINTED

The wagon bridge is getting a good coat of black paint and the unsightly advertising signs are a thing of the past. The riddance of the signs is the work of the ladies' auxiliary to the Commercial Club, who petitioned the county court several weeks ago that they be removed. The bridge

will look very nice when it is all painted. About five men are at work on it and it will be several days yet before it is finished.

The flour mill will soon start running at night shift in order to keep up with the fall wheat that has begun to come in.

The lot with the old building on it on Main street, east of the postoffice, has been sold by Mr. Barnes to Frank Post for something like \$2200. It is going the rounds that the post-office building, owned by Mrs. Etter, was also sold. This is incorrect.

C. B. Horton, the S. P. station agent, went to Portland last evening on a short business trip.

The amount of mail coming to the Springfield office has increased very much lately, especially since the railroad work begun. A great deal more mail comes in than goes out, and about twenty empty sacks are sent out every day.

RAILROAD WORK

BOOMS PRICES OF HAY AND GRAIN

Hay Brings \$20 a Ton—\$1 a Night for Team Feed Charged

E. W. Michael, of Lowell, who was in the city today, tells The Guard that work on the Natron extension is making things lively in that vicinity. One camp, with 200 men, is in working order, and another will be established in a day or two.

Prices of hay and feed are beginning to soar already, \$20 a ton being the price now offered for hay, and the supply is short. Along the road to the railroad camps it costs \$1 a night for horse feed for a team or \$2 for four horses.

The indications are that farmers who have a supply of hay and grain to sell will reap big profits this fall and winter.
