Utah Construction Company Receives Materials at Eugene
 —More Men Arrive

That Eugene is to be a big distributing point for materials and supplies for the Utah Construction Company in building the Natron extension is evidenced by the fact that during the last three days six car loads of building apparatus, consisting of donkey engines and grading outfits, have arrived here and have been unloaded at the local depot yards. Other materials and livestock have been unloaded at Natron and Goshen since construction work began.

A large number of laborers arrived in Eugene this morning from California and were transported to the scene of operations in hacks.
 More will be coming nearly every day until the 2000 men required on the job have been obtained.
 The Utah Construction Company will soon open head offices in Eugene, as predicted time and again by The Guard.
