OREGON IS IN FIFTH PLACE

Rifle Team Makes Good Showing at Camp Perry

Camp Perry, Ohio, Aug. 25.—At the conclusion of the national team match today the Oregon team held fifth place in class B. The Oregon rifleman had a hard fight against the United States service teams. All are remaining for the National individual match and will start home Friday or Saturday.

All the members of the Oregon team are entered in the national individual match and, of course, it is possible that one of the Oregon men will finish close to the top. The Oregon marksmen have demonstrated their ability to hold their place in class A, and since all have been shooting consistently and above center, a dash into the money by one or more of the Oregon men would not be the least unexpected.

Sixteen gold medals, 12 silver and 12 bronze medals will go to those making the highest scores. That at least one of these medals will be won by Oregon sharpshooters is generally conceded by those on the range who have been following closely the work of the many teams.

Breaks Two Records
Cleveland, Aug. 25.—In a marvelous exhibition of speed, Hamburg Belle, the Kentucky mare, on the Randall racetrack today, not only defeated Ulian, the New England gelding, in two straight heats in their first trotting match, but lowered her own record and broke two world's records.

Hamburg Belle cut a second and a half from her best previous mark of 2:02 3-5. Then she broke two world's records in the trotting race by going the first heat in 2:01 3-4. This was followed by a second record, going the second heat in 2:01 3-4, thus establishing an average of 2:01 1-2 for two heats. Ulian was defeated only by a fraction of a second in the first heat. In the second he led to the half-mile post, where he broke.

PREACHER'S SON

WOULD OPEN BALL GAMES WITH PRAYER

Chicago, Aug. 25.—A sermon would be a fitting opening to each major league baseball game played on Sunday, according to Bruce Barton, son of the Rev. W. E. Barton, pastor of the First Congregational Church, Oak Park. He declared last night that although he did not favor Sunday baseball, he thought the plan feasible. Barton said he had mentioned the matter to some of the prominent ministers of Chicago, and had also set the facts before persons connected with the management of major league teams, and that in all instances his suggestion had been approved. Barton says that the matter has been approved by both President Charles Murphy, of the Chicago Nationals, and Charles Ebbets, of Brooklyn.

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ANOTHER RUMOR

OF CHANGED LINE FOR S. P. TRACKS

Lebanon, Or., Aug. 25.—Colonel J. B. Eddy, agent of the Harriman lines in Oregon, has been purchasing a number of tracts of land along the right of way surveyed two years ago for crossing the Santiam river at this city by the woodburn-Natron branch of the Southern Pacific railroad.

The surveyed right-of-way runs through the southern part of the city to the only good crossing of the Santiam from its junction with the north fork to Lebanon, according to the railroad engineers' report of the survey. This change will put Lebanon on the east side line and with the completion of the Natron-Klamath extension the city will be on the main line. The only new road bed to be constructed will be a seven mile stretch from Lebanon to Crabtree.

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
