HOP PICKING BEGINS IN NUMEROUS YARDS OF LANE COUNTY

Warmer Weather Will Cause Vermin to Decrease—Crop Generally Reported Light

Hop picking is progressing in Lane county under most favorable circumstances, most of the yards beginning the first of this week. The warm weather has been felt considerably, and some people who cannot very well stand the heat have been compelled to quit until it gets cooler. Hot weather, however, has a tendency to decrease the number of lice on the vines, making it more pleasant for the pickers in that respect.

Reports from various yards indicate that the crop this fall will be light. This is on account of the neglect of most of the yards during the fore part of the season, the growers being discouraged at the prospects for a good price. Since the price has reached a high figure, the growers have taken every care and precaution to save as many of the hops as possible.

Best pair dressed cockerels, Wyandottes, any variety, \$2.00.
Best pair dressed cockerels, Rhode Island Reds, any variety, \$2.
Best pair dressed cockerels, Leghorns, any variety, \$2.

The demands of the best markets will form the basis of awards. The chickens receiving prizes will become the property of those giving the prize money. Those not receiving prize money will be sold at the fair, and the money received therefor will be sent to the exhibitor, or the chickens will be returned to him, at his option.

The chickens should be on the fair grounds on the evening of Tuesday, September 14, and will be kept there until Friday evening. No entry fee will be charged exhibitors. Intending exhibitors will please notify the undersigned at once, and send chickens without waiting for entry blanks.
