COAL BECOMING MORE POPULAR HERE

Cost Is About the Same as Wood Now and Coal Is Easier to Handle

A great many Eugene people are going to burn coal this winter instead of wood. This is almost an innovation in Oregon and the West, but in the East the woodstove is as infrequently seen as the coal wagon is here. Several Easterners moved here with coal stoves that are used to coal furnaces only. Looking the matter up they find that it is possible to ship coal almost the same price as wood. So it happens that this winter much more is being seen in town than previously. The cost here is about \$10 a ton, for coal that sells in the East for \$3 and \$4, but with the cost of oak, maple and fir wood ranging from \$5 to \$6 a cord it is really as cheap to burn one fuel as the other. The coal is generally considered much the easier and more convenient. A bin in the cellar takes up much less room than the unsightly woodshed, and the coal hod and small shovel beside the stove is more easily handled than the wood box and pokers. In a few years, perhaps, the price of wood has advanced another notch or two and will be shipped here in greater quantities, and sold at a price so that the begrimed coal man with his baskets or coal chute is a familiar character.

FALLS OFF BUILDING. NEARLY BREAKING NECK

Frank Snyder Meets With Bad Accident—Will Be Laid Up for Some Time

Frank Snyder, a carpenter working on a residence being built for Henry Tripp by Homer Brown, had an accident yesterday afternoon which came near costing him his life. He was working on the roof of the building, and had nailed a strip of board on the roof to hold him. The nails penetrated the shingles only, and when Snyder put his weight on it the shingle broke and he fell to the ground, a distance of twenty feet. He alighted on his head and shoulders, and the attending physician says it is a wonder that his neck was not broken. His face and head were badly lacerated and bruised and one of his wrists broken.

STRIKE FORCES

CLOSING OF MILLS

Hoquiam, Wash., Sept. 7.—Following the submission of demands by representatives of nearly 2500 shingle weavers for increase of wages the Polson Shingle Company mills and the East Hoquiam Company mills closed today for an indefinite period. Similar action by other mill owners is expected during the day. It is probable, however, that some of the mills will remain open to clean up their timber on hand, and that when this is exhausted they will close until the strike conditions are ended.

The action of the mill men follows a six-hour session of the local shingle weavers' union yesterday afternoon. At the meeting the workmen decided to submit their demand for an increased scale, and that if the demand was refused a strike would be called at once.
