J. M. Stark, of Hotel Smeede, Buys Large Farm on Which He Will Raise Own Produce

J. M. Stark, the genial proprietor of the Hotel Smeede, has for years been studying the problem of "how to best serve the public in the capacity of proprietor of the leading hotel of a city," and he thinks he has worked out a conclusion that is not only satisfactory to him but eminently satisfactory to his guests.

This unique scheme met with public approval so completely and his hotel patronage increased so rapidly that Mr. Stark was compelled to increase his plant to meet the requirements and accordingly Saturday he purchased the Jacob Strassmair farm, four miles north of Eugene, and containing 140 acres, for which he paid \$14,000 cash.
