Lumbermen's Organization Will Have Big Doings in the South Lane City

There will be big things doing in the lumberman's fraternal order known as the Hoo Hoos, at Cottage Grove on September 25th, when they will hold one of their convocations. F. N. Rosenberg, holding in the order the title of Vice Gerent Snark, whatever that is, says the town he delivered in a chunk to the visitors, and the members of the order of Hoo Hoo in the city and vicinity are going to strain an effort to make history of this meeting.

At this time a number of local lumbermen and dealers expect to enter the mystic portals of Hoo Hoosism, and are at this time screwing up the necessary courage to brave the odds of the night. Some twenty Hoo Hoos are being prepared for the slaughter, about ten of whom are from this city. The necessary instruments of torture will be assembled in Woodman hall, where the sounds of merry-making will ensue long into the night, as when the Hoo Hoos hoots it means some hoisting. KILLED ON HIS WAY TO EUGENE

Pat McCarthy Falls Off Top of a Coach on Passenger Train

Medford, Or., Sept. 20.—Pat McCarthy is dead as the result of trying to beat his way on a Southern Pacific train from Medford to Eugene. McCarthy, who has been one of the construction gang on the city reservoir and on street work in Medford for the past six months, in company with Thomas Curtin, another laborer, started Saturday evening for Eugene, and instead of riding in the car they climbed on top of a coach of train No. 14, that left Medford late Saturday evening. As both were under the influence of liquor friends tried to persuade them to not to try to ride in so dangerous a place, but they insisted. Curtin has not been heard of since, but Sunday forenoon the engineer of train No. 15 saw a man lying by the track just north of Gold Ray. He had his right arm crushed to a pulp near the shoulder, his left hand was cut off at the wrist, and his head was badly bruised. He was placed aboard the train and brought to Medford and taken to a hospital, where his mangled arm was removed at the shoulder and his other arm stump dressed. He was unconscious when found and remained so until his death. It is supposed that he fell off the car, struck an embankment and rolled back on the track. McCarthy had no relatives here and it is not known where he came from.

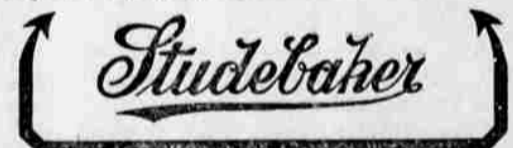
