OBSERVED EDUCATION

DAY, SEPTEMBER 25

School Sanitation Was Special
Branch of Subject
Discussed

September was observed as education month by all the granges in Oregon this year. Springfield grange set apart September 25 as education day. "School Sanitation" being the special branch of the subject discussed.

The subject was opened by Professor Alderman, of the State University, after which there was general discussion by other members present. The subject was outlined as follows:

School grounds—1. Are grounds well drained? 2. Are the walks in good condition? 3. Are there any trees or shrubs? 4. Is there a fuel room? 5. Are the grounds attractive and homelike? 6. Is there a shed provided where children may play sheltered from the rain? 7. If not, why not?

Out houses—1. Are they kept locked before and after school? 2. Are they as far apart as grounds will permit? 3. Are they screened with vines planted to overrun screens? 4. Are walks kept free from obscene language and pictures?

The school building—1. What color are the walls? (Green was recommended as the most restful to the eye.) 2. Are the walls free from marks? 3. Are there a few good pictures placed on the walls? (All agreed that pictures should be such as would inspire pure thought and highest ideals.) 4. Is the room well ventilated? 5. Is there a thermometer, and where placed? Temperature should be about 65 degrees. 6. Stove should be in a corner surrounded by a jacket. 7. Is the general atmosphere of the room homelike? If not, why not? 8. What method of lighting? Number and position of windows and arrangement of shades. 9. Are the desks and seats the right height for children? 10. Is there pure water? 11. Children should furnish their own drinking cups and towels. Why? 12. Do the doors open outward? 13. Is there a place provided for the pupils to eat lunch brought from home? 14. Is there provision made for warm lunches? 15. Is there a place to hang wraps, etc.?

The idea was endorsed by all that parent should visit the school more frequently than is customary. Let the children and teacher feel that they are interested.

Superintendent Dilbeck was appointed a committee to confer with school boards to the end that needed improvements be made.

This discussion was followed by a solo by Mrs. Young, after which she was joined by Mr. and Mrs. Rudman in a trio.

In a beautiful and impressive ceremony Miss Kirkland took the obligation and was made an honorary member of Springfield grange in token of love and appreciation for the beautiful flag presented by her to the grange.

It was decided to hold a fair and farmers' institute on October 29 and 30.

All are invited to come and bring their best fruits, vegetables, cereals, art work, needle work, exhibitions of culinary skill, etc., and place them on exhibition. The best speakers that can be obtained will talk on subjects of interest to all. Pomona grange will be held in Springfield on October 30.

The grange has not missed a meeting all summer with one exception. The day of Mr. Nettleton's funeral grange was suspended on that account. Have had good attendance all the time and have had a literary program at every meeting.

Portland, Sept. 29.—No official of the state of Oregon has received an invitation to attend the ceremonies to be held in Portland Saturday and Sunday of this week except Governor Benson, and the lone invitation to the governor from the Portland committee was very informal, being only a blank invitation in which the governor's name was written.

Chief Justice Frank A. Moore has not received an invitation to even meet Taft in Oregon or to ride in the parade on Saturday.

State Treasurer George A. Steele and Superintendent of Public Instruction J. H. Ackerman were ignored.

Governor Benson was asked to declare Saturday a holiday throughout the state in honor of Taft visiting Portland, but declined, giving as a reason that that day was a half holiday in the courts and would only serve to suspend legal business entirely on that day.

Portland, Sept. 29.—Colonist travel into Oregon and Washington over the Harriman lines has broken all records again for the opening week of the fall season. Reports just received of the total for seven days at the office of General Passenger Agent William McMurray show that the initial seven days of the season saw the Harriman lines bring into the Northwest states 1168 persons, which is 61 more than came the first week of the 1908 fall season. In 1908 the first week embraced a period of eight days, whereas this year the week is a period of seven days. Seven days of 1909 bring over the system 61 persons more than did eight days of 1908.
