EUGENE PUBLIC SCHOOLS GET GOLD MEDAL

Awards Made at Educational Exhibit at the Seattle Exposition

Seattle, Wash., Oct. 10.—The state of Oregon has been awarded the grand prize on its educational exhibit. In view of the fact that Washington has erected a special building for its school exhibits, Oregon's exhibit is here considerably enlarged over the grand prize. Results are from the educational jury and in addition to the grand prize awarded the exhibit as a whole there have been 15 gold medals, 10 silver medals, 8 bronze medals, and 11 honorable mentions awarded the individual parts of the exhibit.

NO DAMAGING FIRES ON MCKENZIE

Fire Garden Returns Home After Summer Work Near Leaburg

S. K. Lewis, who spent the summer in the vicinity of Leaburg as fire warden, returned to his home in Cottage Grove on Saturday says the Sentinel. This was Mr. Lewis' fourth year in the service on the McKenzie, prior to which he was on Mosby creek two years. During the past season there were no fires of a destructive character in his district.

There is a large force of men working near Leaburg on the proposed power plant for Eugene. The McKenzie will furnish the power. Mr. Lewis says that 100 men and teams are engaged on the work.

The fire warden on the McKenzie, about three miles below Gate Creek, has this season taken something over ten million salmon eggs. These are hatched, and when the young salmon are large enough to care for themselves they are returned to the stream.

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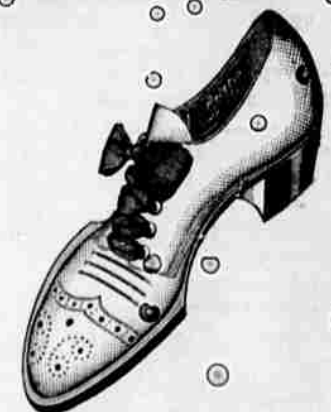
