

MRS. MAGLADRY CAPTURES THIEF IN PORTLAND

Eugene Woman Holds Intruder and Calls for Help—Caught at Hotel

Portland, Oct. 18.—Quick, decisive action on the part of Mrs. J. S. Magladry, of Eugene, resulted in the arrest of a man whom the police believe to be one of the sharpest hotel room thieves in the country. Mrs. Magladry and her husband were guests at the Imperial hotel. When Mrs. Magladry arose yesterday morning she went to an adjoining room to dress, leaving her husband sleeping soundly. Returning a few moments later she found a man ransacking her husband's clothing. Screaming for help, Mrs. Magladry attacked the thief. Awakened by the commotion, the husband sprang from the bed and throttled the intruder. Mrs. Magladry's sister, Mrs. Robert Parker, hurried from the adjoining room, locked the door and removed the key.

Trick to Bluff Way Out.
The prisoner made no effort to break away. The captive said his name was James Davidson, and tried to explain his actions on the ground that it was an unfortunate mistake. Mr. Magladry telephoned to the hotel clerk to send the patrol wagon, the detective force or the fire department to room 307 and remove an unregistered guest. Sergeant Cole and Patrolman Keith were called to cart the captive to the police station.

The Magladry family were induced to postpone their departure from Portland last night. They will remain in the city for another day and prefer charges against the thief. An Old Offender
"Davidson" is well dressed and appears prosperous. He has been stopping at the Portland hotel since Friday. Detective Joe Day believes he recognizes Davidson as Kirk Jones, alias James Scott. Day says he should be able to recognize Jones, as they are old acquaintances, having come together a number of years ago in a way neither is likely to forget. A picture of Jones in the rogues' gallery closely resembles the fellow caught in the Magladry room. There is a deep scar over the left eye, the mouth and nose bear a striking resemblance and the measurements tally to a dot.

EUGENE WILL HAVE DISPLAY AT ALBANY'S BIG APPLE SHOW

Will Show Best of State That Lane County Can Raise Splendid Fruit

Secretary Holt of the Eugene Fruit Growers' Association, today said Lane county would have a good display at the big apple show at Albany beginning a week from Wednesday. County Fruit Inspector Beebe is now gathering the exhibit and it will be collected at the headquarters of the association and neatly packed in time to ship to Albany. Those growers who have good apples and who have not been seen by Mr. Beebe are requested to leave them at the association headquarters. Secretary Holt said the exhibit will be packed in first class style and it is intended to try for the highest awards to be made at the show. He said he is going to show the people of Albany and other parts of the state that Lane county grows the best apples to be had.

Apples in Cold Storage.
All the apples that are coming in now from the members of the association are being placed in cold storage at the plant of the Eugene Ice and Storage Co. Secretary Holt said today that the 2900 apple boxes recently ordered by the association have about gone and he expects 1500 more soon. No apples will be shipped this year by the association. All that are now being stored will be used for home consumption.

Y. M. C. A. NOTES

Another number of "Better Men," has just been received, and it contains many items of interest concerning the progress of the Young Men's Christian Association in Oregon and Idaho. Under the heading "Two Splendid Buildings" is a picture of our own Y. M. C. A. and one of Portland's new home, and the following statement: "Here with are given cuts of the Eugene and Portland buildings. Remarkable progress has been made on the former since laying the cornerstone on July 11th, and should be ready for occupancy soon after January 1st, 1910. The building committee has shown excellent judgment in making plans and letting contracts thereby securing one of the best buildings of its size in the West at a minimum cost. The furnishing committee have already begun the selection of furniture and equipment. The magnificent new home of the Portland association is nearing completion and is already occupied. The boys' rooms, gymnasium, baths and swimming pool, educational class rooms are completed and in daily use. The dormitory section will be ready by Nov. 1st. Our state headquarters will be conveniently located on the third floor. Out-of-town visitors are cordially invited to call when in the city."

When the people of Eugene go to Portland they ought by all means to visit this fine new building which will cost completed nearly half a million dollars. The Young Men's Christian Association building in Portland is a beautiful inside, one of the most attractive places in the city. Eugene ladies should surely make it a point to visit both these buildings for character building. Other items of interest in the "Better Men" follow:
The Pocatello Association has had a marked increase in membership and now has over 600 members. The installation of beds for trainmen is making the building very popular. Many of the beds are used three times in 24 hours. The Sunday afternoon meetings have an average of 75 in attendance, and the religious work program for the coming year includes eight Bible study classes.

The night school of the Portland Association opened September 27, with 425 students, the largest opening enrollment in the history of the institution. Indications point to over 1000 enrolled during the year. Mr. R. C. French, former president of the Western Normal is the educational director.

Some interesting work has been done among the lumber camps of the state and there are plans for buildings in several places. The 25th and 26th of this month, Mr. Rhodes, state secretary of Oregon and Idaho, will be at Kellogg, Idaho, working on plans for an industrial Y. M. C. A. building to be erected by the famous Bunker Hill & Sullivan Mining Co. The first week of November he will spend on a campaign for a \$12,000 building fund for Sellwood, one of Portland's suburbs. The second week, he will spend on a campaign for a \$30,000 building fund at Moscow, Idaho, the seat of the University of Idaho. Moscow has between 10,000 and 15,000 people, and their campaign if successful will eclipse ours in per capita subscription.

On Friday afternoon, Saturday and Sunday, Nov. 26-28, the Fourth Annual Boys' Conference will be held at Albany. A strong and interesting program has been arranged and there and there will be a good delegation sent from Eugene.
