

WELCH SAYS WORK TO BEGIN IMMEDIATELY

Railroad Between Eugene and
Salem Will Be Under
Way in 90 Days

Salem, Oct. 19.—A. Welch, manager of the Portland, Eugene & Eastern Railway, was in the city today, and while here announced that work would immediately commence on the building of the main line between here and Eugene, and that it will be well under way in 90 days. The main line will parallel the Southern Pacific on the east of that road, going out by the reform school and touching at Turner, Marion, Peoria and Junction City on its way to Eugene. A branch will be built, according to Mr. Welch, from Salem to Mehama and the Santiam mining country, and \$150,000 will be expended on a local street railway system and terminals. Mr. Welch states that the road expects to get into Portland over the tracks of the United Railways, now building up the West Side via Hillsboro, and which, it is claimed, will build into Salem, crossing the Willamette river at this point and connecting with the Portland, Eugene & Eastern. The Welch projects have been hanging fire because of a lack of capital, but Mr. Welch states they now have all the money needed to carry out their extensive plans of railroad building, development of waterpower on the Meenzie and other projects.

WILL EXAMINE CANDIDATES FOR FOREST RANGERS

Times and Places Where Official Examinations Will Be Held

Portland, Oct. 19.—Uncle Sam makes a call for men with vigorous minds in vigorous bodies to become forest rangers. The United States Civil Service Commission will hold an examination for this position at every National forest headquarters in the states of Washington and Oregon and Alaska, included in this district, on Monday and Tuesday, October 25 and 26. The examination will be along thoroughly practical lines and will consist of questions regarding land surveying, estimating and scaling timber, the land laws, mining and the live stock business, supplemented by a field test to show the applicant's fitness to perform the actual work of a ranger. Rangers must be between 21 and 40 years of age at the time of taking the examination, able-bodied, and capable of performing hard manual work. Thorough familiarity with the region in which employment is sought is essential, together with actual experience in the kinds of work required of forest officers.

The forest service desires to maintain the highest possible standard of efficiency and degree of advancement of competent men in the service is governed entirely by their capacity. The initial salary is \$900, with the beginner, who starts in as assistant forest ranger. Through good work a ranger can rise to the position of forest ranger with a maximum salary of \$1200 to \$1500. The next step in promotion is to the position of deputy supervisor of a National forest. Rangers who show competency in particular lines of work, such as claims examination and marking and scaling of timber, are advanced and paid according to the work in which they are engaged.

The following is a list of the places in this National forest district at which this examination will be held. Requests for application blanks and further information should be made to the Civil Service Commission at Washington, D. C., or to the forest supervisors.

ESCAPED CONVICTS ARE ALL RETAKEN

Two of the Fugitives Are Dead
and the Others Surrender

Independence, Or., Oct. 18, 4 p. m.—Escaped from starvation, Albert Murray, the half breed Indian convict, who with four other convicts escaped from the Oregon state penitentiary last Friday afternoon, was retaken at 3:45 this afternoon one mile south of Independence, on the farm of Will Scott, a farmer. Later Nicholas was taken also.
Scott discovered Murray and Nicholas, the other convict, asleep under a haystack. He telephoned Marshal Feagles, of Independence, and Feagles and Lloyd Williams, an Independence druggist, immediately departed for Scott's farm. When they arrived Nicholas had fled. Murray, however, gave up without a struggle.
Murray was sent back to Independence in charge of Farmer Stapleton, who had joined the chase, while Williams, Feagles, Fitchard and Scott continued on the trail of Nicholas. The posse shouted repeatedly to the fellow to stop, but the warnings were unheeded and several members of the posse opened fire.
The desperate outlaw was seen to stumble and fall, but he was almost instantly on his feet and running like a deer for the underbrush. In a hail of bullets he gained the shelter of the trees, and the pursuers paused for an instant before plunging into the timber. While deciding upon a plan of action Nicholas shouted from the shelter of the underbrush that he would surrender.

They were also the first to sail over the Coquille river bar. Unaided they steered through the rocks and up the river when it flowed through its old channel around the cliff at Bandon, Or.
