LUMBERING INDUSTRY OF LANE COUNTY

Trade Journal Reports Most of Lane County Mills Operating Steadily

The Oregon Timberman's current number has the following resume of the milling industry of Lane County: Eugene—Booth-Kelly Lumber Co., of Eugene, is operating its four sawmills, located at Springfield, Coburg, Wendling and Saginaw, steadily. Considerable improvement in the equipment and general facilities of the plants is being made. The company is conducting extensive logging operations in the vicinity of their logging plant, their new logging compound locomotive is being built by the Baldwin Locomotive Works. Operations at the Forrest camp, on the McKenzie, will continue, but no logs are being put in the river. Operations at the sawmills are being carefully looked after by A. M. Hagan, assistant to Manager Geo. H. Kelly.

Elmira—Coyote Lumber Company has its new sawmill at Elmira about ready to operate.

Cottage Grove—Brown Lumber Co., of Cottage Grove, is operating its plant on a nice line of orders. This plant is being very ably managed by L. S. Hill, one of the capable sawmill men of the Willamette valley.

With P. H. Rosenberg in charge of the bookkeeping department. The company is operating one camp on Row river, and secures the remainder of its log supply from independent loggers. Manager Lon Hill indulges in one particular luxury, that of driving one of the fanciest steamers in that section. Lon is not only a good lumberman, but he is an expert horseman.

A. L. Woodard, of Cottage Grove, has not been operating his sawmill steadily during the summer, but expects to resume operations soon. A new planing shed, 8x15 Hoat planer and engine for driving the planing mill have been added to the plant. The planing is in operation.

Springfield—Fischer-Bally Lumber Company, Springfield, are installing a 40,000 capacity sawmill. Some of the equipment is being taken from one of the Fischer Bros' plants at Marcola. The new mill will be ready to operate about the first of November.

Along the Oregon Southeastern Disston—Disston Lumber Company will resume operations about the first of February. Some minor improvements will be made to the plant, which is equipped with a Berlin saw and 6x15 Hoyt planer. Manager Harry Crites has accepted a contract and is cutting wood for the railroad during the slack time with him in the lumber business. A drag saw is being used for this purpose.

Wildwood—Wildwood Lumber Co. has installed a planer shed, 30x60, and a new No. 10 Berlin sizer. The plant had been shut down since the first of July, but will resume about the 15th of October. J. J. Kreiger is manager.

Star—Star Lumber Company has been operating most of the time. The company has purchased a tract of timber and secured a site near Disston, to where its plant will be removed this fall. An additional boiler and engine will be installed and the capacity of the plant increased.

Taylor & Sons, Star, whose plant is located at Vaughn spur, resumed operations about three months ago. Manager Taylor has some samples of fresh grain fir, which he calls "catface," the result of a blight on the tree when young. Mr. Taylor will have the material finished at a Portland factory and use them for veneered door panels.

Row River Lumber Company, at Star, whose plant is also located at Vaughn spur, has been operating for about five months, cutting about 40,000 feet per day. This plant consists of the frame and equipment of the mill formerly owned and operated by J. H. Chambers, at Alca. Building operations are going forward all the time at this mill, and when completed will be one of the best plants in the Row river country. The company is contemplating installing a tram and cable system for doing its logging. Albert Stocks is manager of the company and W. T. Hankins secretary.

Cerro Gordo—Cerro Gordo Lumber Company's plant is located about two miles from this point, the product being flumed to the railroad. The plant has not been operating for some time on account of a scarcity of water. Elmer Doolittle is manager of this company.

Dorena—J. H. Chambers Lumber Company, Dorena, is operating its planing mill and kilns at Dorena. The sawmill is located about two miles from the railroad, the lumber being flumed down. The plant has a capacity of 40,000 feet per day, but has not been in operation for about three months, on account of a shortage in water supply. Manager Fred Russell has a splendid body of timber and a model plant.

James Lands is operating a camp at Dorena, the output being consumed by the Brown Lumber Company, of Cottage Grove.

McKibben Bros' sawmill is located at McKibben spur, about two miles from Cottage Grove. Their present plant is located on the exact site of the one destroyed by fire about a year ago. The plant cuts about 20,000 feet per day. All their claims are consumed by the Cottage Grove Manufacturing Company, in its planing mill and wood-working plant at Cottage Grove.

SPRINGFIELD AND VICINITY

GREAT EXPLOSION OF DYNAMITE

Four thousands pounds of dynamite exploded at once in the side of a hill is quite capable of tearing a large hole. It was such a charge as this that was exploded above Natron on the railroad right-of-way the startled Springfield, shaking and rattling the windows. The blast was plainly felt here.

Until yesterday there has been a large point of rock abutting the river directly across the railroad line. Now this lies in the river and the road-way is clear. For the past month men with drills have been lancing both sides of the mountain and the holes filled with dynamite. By yesterday noon they had finished their work and from the cap on the explosive in each hole wires led and connected together with two wires which were then carried to about a quarter of a mile down the road. As soon as it was ascertained that the vicinity of the hill was cleared from any human life the button was pressed that sent an electric current through the wires. In an instant an immense black cloud of rock and earth rose to a height of several hundred feet followed by a deafening roar.

The column of smoke and debris could be seen for miles. Reports from Pleasant Hill say that it could be seen there. The rattling of windows was not noticed in Eugene as much as in Springfield.

ROADS GETTING IN BAD SHAPE

The livery men and farmers report the roads out of Springfield very bad for the small amount of rain had so far. The road from Goshen to Lowell is going to be very badly cut up this winter by the freighting that is done over it. Already it is very bad. Some half dozen freighters can be passed either way on the road now.
