SOUTHERN PACIFIC CO. FILES VIGOROUS KICK AGAINST ASSESSMENT

Wants It Reduced from \$38,000 to \$20,000 Per Mile in Lane County

The Southern Pacific Company has filed a vigorous protest with the Lane county board of equalization, now in session, against the \$38,000-a-mile valuation placed upon the rolling stock and the main line roadbed of the company in this county, and the valuation of \$7.20 per acre placed upon the company's timber lands.

The company asks that the \$38,000 figure be reduced to \$20,000, and that the timber land valuation be placed at \$4 per acre.

The Western Union Telegraph Co. has also protested against the raise in its assessment. Assessor Keeney says this company files a kick every year.

No action has yet been taken by the board of equalization. The valuation on the railroad company's property was raised this year by the assessor in accordance with an agreement among the assessors of the state.

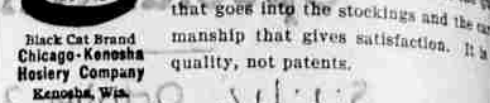
