TROLLEY LINES CREATE BUSINESS

Half-hour electric service will be instituted on the Eugene-Springfield line tomorrow. This will be a great convenience, as well as illustrating the rapid growth of the trolley car business. The line is helping both Eugene and Springfield, and there will be a similar record when the line is extended to Junction. Eugene and Junction will both feel the beneficial effect of it, as the history of other towns similarly connected proves beyond a doubt. After the Boise-Caldwell line in Idaho was completed the latter town, although much smaller than the former, experienced a veritable boom. The Spokane-Coeur d'Alene City line has built the latter place into a city of 12,000 people from a mere village in about four years. Smaller towns, near Walla Walla, Wash., have similarly prospered through connection with the larger city by trolley lines.

In most of the cases referred to the smaller towns have at first opposed the building of these lines because they feared a loss of their retail trade to the nearby city, but lived to learn that the reverse was true. The electric road, by its rapid development of the country, has so stimulated and increased business that it has brought prosperity alike to the city and the towns with which it has been connected. In the East examples like those above may be multiplied by the score. Springfield is growing faster than ever since the electric line was put in operation to Eugene, and Junction City will take on new life the moment the trolley car begins its regular trip to that place. Mark this prediction.
