The members of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union gave a reception Wednesday to the new members at the home of their president, Mrs. T. H. Ellis.

Members and guests numbered 49. A program was rendered and then a bountiful repast and social time were enjoyed.

After the prepared program plans for the coming year were mentioned, and scientific instructions in the public schools discussed. This led up to the sympathy and co-operation we might naturally expect of teachers, who are almost universally friends of temperance. Next the influence of the teacher and the effect of destructive criticism on the student body was touched upon.

It was the consensus of opinion that, as this is a Christian nation and so looked upon by the world, that, inasmuch as we accept the Bible as the word of God, and as our public schools and universities are supported by the people, these same people have a right to demand that no instructors in these schools promulgate views inimical to the plainest and most essential teachings of the word. And, while every man or woman has a right to his or her opinion, an educated conscience, or even an average sense of honor, would forbid the employe from assailing or in any way weakening the faith of the young, who have not investigated, and too often are willing to accept the theories of others because they are new or suit their fancies.

We realize that the schools have many difficulties to meet, but chief among these is not church influence, but rather the lack of the same.

A motion was carried that we make our opinions known on these subjects and also comment the vigilance of the ministers who are ready to "reprove and rebuke with long suffering and doctrine."

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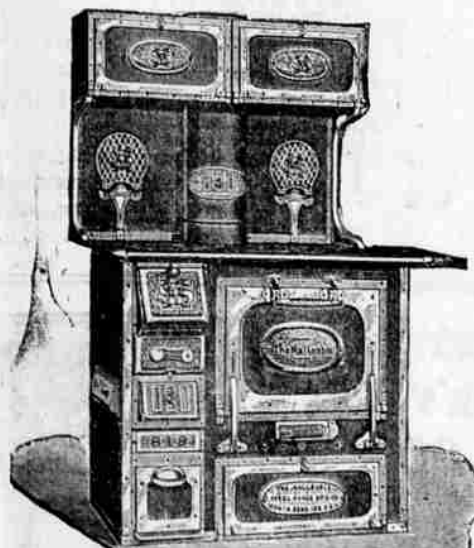
