FORGERY NOW CHARGE AGAINST PROF. M'KEE

Former Eugene School Principal Is in All Kinds of Trouble

Oregon City, Or., Nov. 6.—Walter C. McKee, ex-Superintendent of the Oregon City schools, was arrested yesterday by Constable Miles at the McKee home, 1684 East Seventeenth street, in Sellwood. McKee was indicted this morning by the grand jury on a charge of forgery and Judge Campbell immediately issued a bench warrant for his arrest. Shortly after his arrival here he was arraigned and entered a plea of not guilty. His trial has been set for Thursday, November 18, and he will be defended by George C. Brownell. In default of \$500 bail McKee was remanded to the county jail.

The ex-school superintendent was arrested last Friday morning at the offices of the Portland Gas Company, in Portland, where he was employed as bookkeeper, on a charge of larceny by bailee, the specific complaint being that he converted to his own use money belonging to the student body of the Oregon City High School. He was released on \$150 cash bail and his preliminary examination set for today afternoon.

Later, however, the examination was postponed until next Saturday, but in the meantime the grand jury made an investigation of the charges against McKee, with the result that his indictment was returned.

It is probable that the charge of larceny by bailee will not be pressed, but that McKee will be prosecuted on the charge of forging the name of E. E. Brodie to a note for \$100 and obtaining the money from the First National Bank of Oregon City. The note was ultimately paid by McKee.

HAS OREGON ELECTRIC BOUGHT THE P. E. & E.?

Rumor That Survey Now Being Made to Junction on Prairie is for the O. E.

The Portland Telegram, in speaking of the survey now being made by the Portland, Eugene and Eastern railway, along the prairie road between Eugene and Junction City, says:

"In view of the announcement that the Oregon Electric Company intends, aside from entering Eugene by way of its main line south from Albany, also to reach Eugene by a branch line up the west side, through Corvallis, the two lines to join at Eugene, it is believed that the P. E. & E. has been absorbed by the larger company, and that the survey now being made along the prairie road is for the Oregon Electric. West Side branch. Other actions of the Welch people have also given rise to the belief that the Oregon Electric has purchased the P. E. & E. holdings."

YOUNG JESSE JAMES IN DIVORCE SUIT

Son of Famous Bandit and His Marital Troubles Are Haled Into Court

Kansas City, Mo., Nov. 5.—Jesse James, Jr., son of the famous bandit, and now living in this city, was made defendant in a divorce suit filed here by his wife yesterday.

Mrs. James alleges indignities and declares that her husband has developed a habit of staying out late at night and refusing to tell her where he has been. They were married in January, 1900. The couple separated last September, their four small daughters remaining with their mother.

James formerly ran a cigar store here and then opened a pawnbroker's shop. Later he took up the study of criminal law, and practiced in the local courts. A few months before his marriage he was acquitted of complicity in the Missouri Pacific train robbery east of here, after a sensational trial.
