TO SERVE FREE
LUNCH ON CARS**

Innovation on Portland-Salem
Trolley Line—Observation Cars

Portland, Nov. 6.—Improvements in service and equipment which will include the establishment of solid vestibuled trains, observation cars and the innovation of free lunches therein, have been authorized by the Oregon Electric Railway Company, on the run from Portland to Salem. The sum appropriated for these and other improvements aggregate \$150,000.

In establishing a free buffet service the Oregon Electric will put in a novelty in interurban transportation never before attempted. It is said by any electric railway in the United States.

Specifications have been adopted for three observation cars and they will be the finest that can be purchased, costing \$15,000 each. They will be operated on four trains each way daily between Portland and Salem and if they prove as popular as is now anticipated, similar cars will be put in service later on the Forest Grove line.
