TURKEYS BEGINNING TO ARRIVE FOR THE LOCAL MARKETS

Not Much of a Market for Them Here on Account of Big Shipments from Oakland

The Eugene commission houses are beginning to receive turkeys for the Thanksgiving trade, the first coming in today. There is not much of a market here for them, however, on account of the large shipments made to Portland and Seattle from Oakland and other Douglas county points where they make a specialty of raising them. Fifteen cents per pound are being paid by the local dealers for the Thanksgiving birds. This is an advance of one cent during the last few days. There will be a good local market for the birds, as Eugene people must have them or nothing on the nation's holiday, but there will not be very many shipped out by the local commission houses.

Chickens are 10 cents a pound straight now and the wholesalers are paying from 35 to 37 1/2 cents per dozen for eggs when they can get them. They are still very scarce. One commission received a fine car of onions from Woodburn yesterday. They wholesaled at \$1.75 a hundred pounds.
