COST OF CANAL

MORE THAN DOUBLE

Raise of Prices in Material and Labor Given As the Cause

Washington, D. C., Nov. 21.—With the Panama Canal virtually half finished, the members of the Isthmian Canal commission awakened to the fact that this waterway will cost more than twice the amount of the original estimate. In other words, it is now estimated that the canal, when finished and opened to traffic, will represent a total expenditure of \$375,201,000. When the canal project was adopted it was estimated to cost only \$144,233,358.

Chairman Tawney, of the house committee on appropriations, on his arrival at Panama with his committee, talked of paring down the estimates of the commission and reducing the cost of the construction. It is not seriously thought, however, that anything worthy of note could be accomplished in this direction. Rather, the impression prevails that when the last dollar has been spent the cost of the canal will be found to exceed rather than run under the latest estimate of \$375,000,000. In its annual report, made public today, the Isthmian Canal commission discusses this question of cost, saying:

Wages and Material Jump
"Wages have increased and the cost of materials and manufactured articles has risen. Prosperous conditions in the United States, combined with the unsavory reputation that the Isthmus had regarding its healthfulness, made it necessary to secure labor to increase the wage scales from 30 to 50 per cent over those paid in the United States for similar classes of work. Certain gratuities as additional inducements were also offered, which in the main have since been continued. Moreover, the provisions of the eight-hour law were made applicable to the Isthmians."

The dredging fleet during the year consisted of one seagoing suction dredge, one 20-inch suction and pipe-line dredge, one 5-yard dipper dredge and four French ladder dredges, one of the latter being in commission only since May 10. During the year, 8,475,331 cubic yards of material were removed from the channel proper, which is completed for about five miles from deep water in the Pacific.

A steady increase of the unskilled labor force continued until it reached its maximum on April 28, when the reports show a total of 33,699 men actually working for the commission and the Panama railroad, the largest force of record. The number of Europeans and West Indians brought to the Isthmus during the year shows a decrease over the preceding year; they numbered 741 Europeans and 1892 West Indians. The force of European laborers decreased as the Spanish government prohibited emigration to Panama, so that no new men are now procurable from that source by recruitment.

The total value of material received during the year amounted to \$8,600,000, and stocks on hand June 30, totaled \$3,000,000.

ON NEW ROAD

Roseburg, Or., Nov. 21.—Advice received in this city as to the effect that J. H. Somers has left Portland by steamer with a crew of men and supplies to begin the location of the electric railway from Coos Bay to Roseburg.

This is the line that is to be built by Kuetner & Haas, of Portland, assisted by local capital. The promoters were to place a bond in the sum of \$50,000, to guarantee the completion of the road within two years, and are expected in Roseburg shortly to sign the bond.

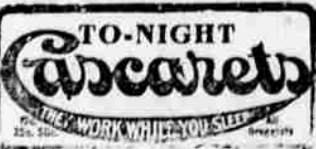

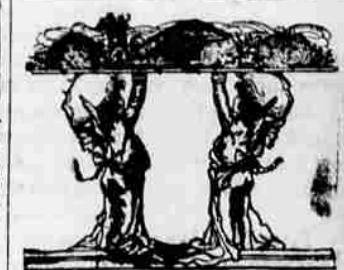
