CAPITAL GRAFT CASES ON TRIAL

Joseph M. Huston Is Facing the Jury at Harrisburg Today

Harrisburg, Pa., Nov. 29.—Joseph M. Huston, architect, who is alleged to have been involved in the mammoth graft conspiracy to defraud the state in connection with the building and furnishing of the new Pennsylvania state capitol, will be placed on trial today. The specific charge against Huston is conspiracy to defraud the state in connection with a bill for 272 chairs.

The commonwealth's lawyers say they propose to combat any effort Huston's attorneys may make to secure another continuance of the trial. A special panel of jurymen has been drawn from which to select the jury. Huston was indicted with John H. Sanderson, the contractor, since deceased; ex-Auditor General W. P. Snyder, ex-State Treasurer W. L. Mathews, deceased, and ex-Superintendent J. M. Shumaker on a charge of conspiracy to defraud the state on an invoice of desks.

Snyder and Shumaker have been granted severances, and Huston's trial has been twice postponed.

Snyder was convicted, but has appealed to the supreme court from the refusal of Judge Kunkel to grant a new trial. The Snyder appeal will not be argued until the supreme court meets here on May 23 of next year.

TOBACCO PRODUCTION IS 750,000,000 POUNDS

Washington, Nov. 29.—More than 15,000,000 pounds of clear tobacco, and nearly four times that quantity of other types was grown in the United States in 1908, according to a bulletin issued by the department of agriculture today. Kentucky leads all the states in tobacco grown, producing more than one-ninth of the entire crop of the world. Less than one per cent of the country's crop is grown west of the Mississippi river.

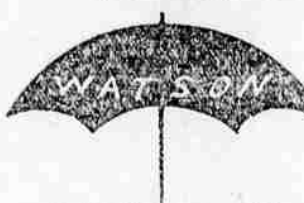
