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WASHINGTON MADE MONEY AT FOOTBALL

Seattle, Wash., Dec. 6.—Football enriched the University of Washington athletic fund by \$2250 this year, according to the report of Graduate Manager Victor Zednik. The receipts from gridiron struggles amounted to \$9417.32, while the expenses totalled \$7100. Considering the fact that University of Washington authorities, at the beginning of the season, expected to lose a few thousand dollars on the season, the financial showing is all the more creditable. Out of the \$7100 spent, many improvements of a permanent character have been made and these will bring bigger returns next year. Washington's profit in the Thanksgiving day game with the University of Oregon was \$4900. The other local game, Washington playing two conference games at home, with the Whitman College eleven, netted \$2600.

An athletic stadium to cost \$40,000 is to be constructed on the university campus. A committee has been named to take charge of the matter. Present plans contemplate the construction of a stadium to hold 20,000 persons within which is to be a quarter-mile track, a gridiron and baseball field.
