NATIONAL RED CROSS REORGANIZES

Washington, Dec. 7.—All branch organizations of the American National Red Cross Society were abolished today, and in their stead bodies to be known as chapters will be organized. This action was confirmed at the session of the national organization in Washington today.

These chapters will be formed by resolutions of subdivisions existing at present, directed to headquarters at Washington, and governing boards in each state will have direct supervision of the chapters. The addition of the state governing boards and the substitution of the word chapter for subdivision in the title of the local organizations are the chief points of change in the plan of the reorganization. This, however, it is believed, will add greatly to the efficiency of the central body as a working force.

OKLAHOMA'S TWO-CENT RATE CASE

St. Louis, Dec. 7.—Arguments in the case brought by leading Oklahoma railroads against the State of Oklahoma, to test the constitutionality of the two-cent fare law and certain freight rates fixed by the state, will be heard today by Judge Hook, of the United States district court. Attorney-General West, of Oklahoma, tried in vain to keep the case out of the federal courts until all remedies offered by Oklahoma's laws and constitution had been exhausted.
