Denver, Dec. 8.—Miss Arizona Owens, who completed her 435-mile walk from Shoshone, Wyo., to Denver, last night at 7:30 o'clock, appears little the worse this morning for her experience with an almost continuous blizzard during her 16-day trip.

"To make a living" is Miss Owens' explanation for the unusual journey, which she says she made on a wager that she could accomplish the feat in 17 days. Miss Owens, who is small and almost frail, says she has walked long distances before in the South and in Missouri. She is a native of Arizona.

PORTLAND TO HAVE 15-STORY BLOCK

Portland, Dec. 10.—Plans for a 15-story business block and office building, to be the largest and finest structure in Portland, were filed with City Building Inspector Dobson yesterday, and a building permit will be issued within a few days. The structure is for John H. Yeon, and the building is to be erected on the northeast corner of Fifth and Alder streets. The building will be the tallest in the city, rising full 15 stories, to which will be added a cupola.

SPORTING NEWS

SALT LAKE CITY

WILL GET FIGHT

Boston, Mass., Dec. 9.—Tex Rickard, accompanied by his wife, arrived in this city late today, and although in fairly good humor, waxed wroth when asked about the story that Jimmy Coffroth was behind him in the Johnson-Jeffries fight. Tex said:

"You can put down one thing for me—Coffroth has nothing to do with the fight, and any one who can produce evidence showing that he is can get \$5000 of my money."

As for California getting the fight, Rickard declared that Salt Lake City had been chosen, and unless there is some slip in the program the fight will take place in the Salt Palace, which has a seating capacity of 30,000. Continuing about the fight, the promoter said:

"As for the referee there is but one man from California whom I would consider. That man is Eddie Graney, and I am willing to have him act in that capacity. I am running the fight and will have something to say about it. The story has been circulated to the effect that the fighters have arranged to stall in order to make the pictures more realistic is a fake, and I have \$10,000 to give to any charity if it can be proven true."

As a feature of the big fight Rickard today signed articles with Jimmy Walsh, of Boston, for a fight with Digger Stanley, of England, for thebantam-weight championship of the world. If Stanley agrees the bout will be a preliminary to the big event. He is also arranging for another match between Stanley Ketchel and Sam Langford, which will take place about a month before the Johnson-Jeffries mill.

CROSS-COUNTRY RACE

ON DECEMBER 17

One of the strongest features of Bill Hayward's famous training is cross-country running. He has developed some great distance men for Oregon, and always emphasizes cross-country work as an important part of the program.

Candidates have been busy all year going over the excellent five-mile course and since the cessation of football many new men have turned out.

As usual, there will be an inter-class cross-country run. This season it will be held December 17, the day before the Christmas holidays vacation period begins. A handsome silver cup will be donated to the winning class team and first, second and third place men will receive gold, silver and bronze medals respectively.

The try-outs for the class teams will be held December 11, over a three and one-half mile course. Each class met the past week and elected captains of the prospective teams. George Riddell, Oregon's strongest miler, will captain the seniors. McGuire, late of Stanford, and Garra-brant will lead the juniors and sophomores, while the freshmen elected George McClure, a Eugene high lad, who has been showing up well of late.

A meet will be held with O. A. C. some time in January, and later in the year the varsity team will meet the University of Washington, which puts out a crack cross-country team.

Hayward supports winter training, as he says the poorer man, with the advantage of training all winter, will undoubtedly beat the man who has only the six weeks of spring work the Oregon climate allows.
