FOUR YOUNG PEOPLE DROWN IN COLUMBIA

Launch Turned Turtle Near Rainier—Three Hung On Till Morning

Rainier, Or., Dec. 12.—Four young people, residents of Maygers, Or., met terrible deaths by drowning in the Columbia river early Sunday morning when a launch in which they were riding turned turtle at Burton's landing, spilling the party of seven into the icy cold water. Three of the party were rescued after hanging to grim death for seven hours, while the fourth seemed like centuries.

The dead are: Miss Selma Hendrickson, aged 17; Anna Hendrickson, aged 19; Grace Waud, aged 16, and Lee Barber, aged 20. The rescued are: Pearl Proctor, aged 20; Frank Kasper, aged 20, and Amos Card, aged 19. Got Too Sleepy Lee Barber, who hung on for nearly an hour and a half, was first to let go. "I'm getting sleepy," he said. "I'm going to sleep," and he slipped back into the water and did not rise. The next to drop off was Miss Selma Hendrickson, who held on perhaps half an hour longer. Soon afterward Anna Hendrickson, her sister, went to a watery grave. The survivors clung to the boat until 6 a. m., making just seven hours in all, when the tugboat Burton came along and answering their cries, rescued them. They were brought to Rainier and left for their home in Maygers Sunday morning. The trio were all in good health and not much the worse for their experience.

MANY CHANGES IN HARRIMAN OFFICIALS

Portland, Dec. 12.—Changes in the traffic department of the Harriman lines in the Northwest, which have been under consideration ever since Mr. Harriman's last sickness took a turn that he knew ended his active management of his lines, were announced officially this morning. They are: R. B. Miller, general freight agent of the O. R. & N. and the Harriman lines in Oregon, becomes traffic manager of the O. R. & N. and the Southern Pacific lines in Oregon and the Oregon & Washington, effective January 1, 1910. Coman Succeeds Miller Wilbur E. Coman, first assistant general freight agent of the O. R. & N. and the Southern Pacific lines in Oregon, becomes general freight agent of these lines, succeeding Mr. Miller. William D. Skinner, second assistant freight agent of the O. R. & N., and the Southern Pacific lines in Oregon, becomes general freight and passenger agent of the Oregon & Washington, with headquarters in Seattle. F. W. Robinson becomes assistant general freight agent of the lines in Oregon, to succeed Mr. Coman.
