WISE SHOPPERS ALREADY BUYING THEIR PRESENTS

Eugene Stores Already Crowded—Men Are the Belated Ones

With Christmas less than a fortnight off, the wise shoppers of Eugene are already in the midst of the annual turmoil of present-buying. The stores throughout the city have taken on the most alluring Yuletide aspects and the throngs already are appearing early and remaining late. The shopping of the thoughtful and provident is now rapidly reaching its zenith, and yesterday and today heavy trading was noted in all classes and conditions of stores where presents suitable for Christmas gifts are to be had. The trading is heavier than at the corresponding date last year, but whether this fact is to be attributed to a growing discretion or a growing population no one makes bold to say.

Never has such a wide variety been shown. And when it is considered that many of the stores will rearrange and supplement their holiday displays several times between now and the day before the advent of Kris Kringle, the difficulty that confronts the shopper in making selections is readily understood.

To attempt a classification, much less a complete list, of the things suitable for gifts, as displayed thus early, is a task that would afford pleasurable amusement for a corps of trained encyclopedia compilers. In the most general way it may be said that there is a little of everything, with a number of other things added for good measure.

Hence the provident shopper is out early contending with the difficulties of selection. By the end of this week or the middle of next this class will have completed the arduous if pleasurable duty. There will be added the comfort of an easy conscience.

The unwise shopper, of course, is going sorely about his daily routine. The masculine form is used in this instance partly because of the dictates of grammar, and mainly because the bulk of the offenders are of that sex. It was noticeable that the shopping crowds yesterday and today were mostly women. Tradespeople say that the week-end turmoil, which causes the clerks to wish Christmas could never be, is invariably made up of men.

Those of humanitarian instincts are urging early trading this year, and this cry, it is hoped, will bear fruit ere many days. It is pointed out by the dealers that there would be no objection if it were the belated ones who had to suffer for the consequence of their negligence.

But the burden falls upon the sales forces. A month's work, or even several months' has to be crowded into the home stretch leading up to Christmas eve. The man with 57 varieties of relatives who goes out 57 minutes before the stores close on Christmas eve and attempts to visit 57 of them and purchase 57 varieties of presents, is bound to make several persons besides himself supremely miserable in consequence of his ill-advised procrastination.

C. D. HULL LIVED AT COTTAGE GROVE

Young Man Electrocutated at Seattle Former O. A. C. Student Instead of U. O.

C. D. Hull, mentioned in The Guard's special dispatch from Seattle a few days ago as being electrocuted, was a Cottage Grove boy and a former student of the O. A. C. Instead of the U. O. C., as stated. The Leader says:

Charles D. Hull was born in Illinois 23 years ago and came to this place with his parents to live when he was but five years old. After graduating from the eighth grade in the Cottage Grove schools, he took the four years' high school course here and then entered the electrical department of the Oregon Agricultural College, from which he graduated last spring. He soon found employment at Seattle as a street car conductor, from which position he was recently promoted to a position in the power plant of the company in which he met an untimely death. He was a very studious, industrious and exemplary young man, who was held in the highest esteem by all who knew him. The announcement of his death was a severe blow to his parents and many friends here, who greatly deplore the fact that such a promising career should be so suddenly brought to an end. Mr. Hull left last night for Seattle, to bring the remains of his son to this city for burial, and the family has the heartfelt sympathy of all in their sad bereavement.

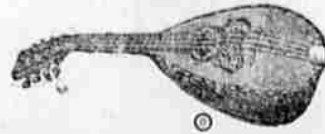
