300 ACRES FRUIT
Individual Growers at Oreswell
Will Plant That
Number

That citizens of Oreswell and vicinity are going to do their share toward supplying the ever increasing demand for fruit is shown by the large amount of unexcelled fruit land in this locality which will be planted this Winter and next Spring says the Chronicle. Nearly every man who owns fruit land here is going to plant trees, and the coming year will see more new land in fruit culture in this section than any year previous.

Oregon now ranks as the banner apple state in the Union. In the New England States Oregon apples are now selling at 10 cents each. Each year sees a greater demand. There is no danger of an overproduction for the reason that there is always a market at home and abroad for fruit such as Oregon raises. Statistics show that even with the new acreage which comes into bearing each year, the supply is shorter every year.

To prove that this is a specially favored section for fruit raising all that is necessary to do is show the product. It speaks for itself. Those who set their land to fruit are preparing for themselves a sure and steady income, and fruit will enhance the value of their land as no other crop will.

SPORTING NEWS

HAYWARD PLEASED WITH YESTERDAY'S RACE

"I am very much pleased with the race. The time was faster than last year. The course was half a mile longer. Last year the time was 15:25. I am especially pleased with that man McClure. I expected to see him win."

These were a few of the enthusiastic remarks made by "Bill" Hayward after seeing fourteen of his distance men run the three and a half mile course in 16 minutes and 54 seconds yesterday afternoon.

The next cross-country run will be with Corvallis, probably here, on the 22d of February. The trip to Seattle which has been planned will be called off, for there is no way to finance it.

In McClure the University has a remarkable mile man, possibly the greatest ever turned out here. His career has been remarkable, for the first race he ever ran was last year for the Eugene High school.

Last year McClure turned out on the track more as a matter of pastime than anything else. Unexpectedly he had a chance to go with the High school track team to Salem. There he ran his first race, and established the high school record for the mile in 4:50. He has trained this year carefully, and yesterday surprised the University by defeating both Garbrandt and Riddell in the annual cross-country run.

WASHINGTON TO HAVE COACH DOBIE AGAIN

Seattle, Dec. 16.—There is rejoicing at the University of Washington today. Coach Gilmour Dobie is coming back.

The tall football instructor has decided to remain with the local institution, after hesitating several weeks. Dobie's decision was announced at the Sigma Nu fraternity house last night, where a smoker was held in honor of the football team, and the man who developed it into a championship aggregation.

The Minnesota man gladdened the hearts of the college men by declaring that he had reached a determination to coach Washington again, and when Dobie had finished his little speech there was an outburst of the greatest enthusiasm.

Dobie expects to leave today for California for a visit with his sister.

JEFFRIES WILL HAVE ARMY OF TRAINERS

New York, Dec. 16.—Bob Armstrong, the colored heavyweight, who helped train Jack Johnson for his recent fight with Ketchel, has been added to Jeffries' long string of sparring partners, according to Jeffries' advisers here. If Armstrong accepts the offer and the other pugilists named are at the boiler-maker's training camp, the latter will have these energetic helpers: Corbett, Tommy Ryan, Berger, Armstrong, "Kid" McCoy, Jack Root and Jack McCormick.

BASKETBALL TEAM CHOSEN AFTER XMAS

Soon after Christmas vacation, after the interclass basketball series is finished, the University basketball team will be chosen. The new gym will be ready for use by that time, and the team will hold daily practice for the schedule that is partially made out. Few dates have been made. Whitman will play here on February 2. Two games will be played with O. A. C., one at each place; Washington plays here and a game will probably be played with Willamette. The latter wished a game during the holidays but the University cannot play them until later, as they have neither team nor hall yet.

No basketball has been played here for two years, and the advantages are against the team. However, some classy ball has been shown in the inter-class series now being played.
