MANAGER LAMBERTH SAYS WORK ON SPRINGFIELD BRIDGE MAY SOON BEGIN

Lay Track to End of Trestle to Enable Contractor Roney to Get Material to Ground

The report comes from Manager Lambirth, of the P. E. & E., that he will at once repair the trestle at West Springfield, lay rails and string trolley wires to the river and run the cars that far. The object of this is to accommodate L. N. Roney, who has the contract to build the trestle across the river to Springfield. He says that the contractor will place a force of men at work at once getting material ready and doing all that is possible, so that the construction of the bridge may commence just as early in the spring as the danger of high water is over. Material can be hauled on a flat car along the track where it is needed.

Mr. Roney, when interviewed by a reporter this afternoon, would not make any statement regarding the matter, simply saying: "I have positively nothing to say about it, for the present at least."

Mr. Roney's policy is more construction and less talk.
