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OLD RESIDENT OF SIUSLAW WRITES ABOUT NEED OF RAILROAD

Point Terrace, Or., Jan. 3, 1910.

Editor Guard:—You may like to hear from the wild and woolly West. Now that this part of Lane county has bonded itself for the improvement of its harbor and as the bonds have been disposed of and the contract let and signed, work to commence in 30 days on the levee, who not realize the need of quick transportation for the disposal of its products. You can travel down the Siu-slaw river and see aules hanging on the trees and no way to market them; all kinds of small fruit go to waste for the want of a market, and the people down here rejoice when you visit road railroad news in your paper. The writer of this located on the Siu-slaw river in 1878, and was on the town site of Eugene in May, 1880. I have been a resident more or less since that time in the midst of a large timber belt, and we have three sawmills here that are idle a great part of the season on account of lack of navigation. The products are not shipped in the same way. Now if Eugene will arrange for the portion of traffic and commerce throwing dirt in the direction for a railroad, we will all take off our hats to her. We have the finest all-around country in the West, and there is power all along the line. Why wait until some firm steps in and then we will be sorry we did not act. We must have relief, and that will be a railroad in the near future.
