NORTHWEST IS FARM CENTER OF UNITED STATES

Volume of Agricultural Products of North Pacific States Is Surprising

Spokane, Wash., Jan. 10.—Four hundred and four million dollars is the value of the products of 211,000 farms in Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana in 1909, a gain of 75 per cent. since 1900. The assets of the farmers are practically double those of 1904, their debts are considerably less, while the surplus is larger than ever before in the history of the country. The number of farms and the wealth productions in the four states are approximately as follows:

The foregoing figures show there is need for more farms in the northwestern states and that millions of acres of lands, now idle, could be put under cultivation on a substantial revenue-paying basis. There are many who believe that the days of the bonanza farms are numbered, which means that with smaller holding there will be more intensive farming, and, as a consequence, larger acre crops.

The farm products of 1909 in the inland empire, taking in Eastern Washington, Oregon, North and Central Idaho, are valued at \$110,000,000. A normal apple crop at present prices instead of a yield ranging from 35 to 40 per cent. would have placed the figures approximately \$117,000,000 as against about \$90,000,000 in 1908.

Wheat, of course, was the big factor, the four states producing more than 75,000,000 bushels, of which 35,780,000 bushels is credited to Washington, 16,377,000 bushels for Oregon, 14,465,000 bushels for Idaho and the rest for Montana. The other farm products entering into the computation are fruit, oats, barley, rye, hay, sugar beets, potatoes, garden products, live stock, dairy products and poultry and eggs.

The foregoing figures become important in the development of the western country when it is known that in many instances the products of the older farming state are not as valuable as those in the quarter of a century ago were considered to be largely worthless lands. It means, too, that with the influx of population and outside capital for development purposes there will be more farms and a greater wealth production.

There are 6,741,000 farms, or about 1,000,000 more than in 1899, in the United States today, and the value of the products for 1909 is placed at \$9,600,000,000. This shows that fully one-third of the population of the country is engaged in the various forms of agriculture.

It is believed by many that the result of the country life and back-to-the-land movement will be to raise the percentage of farmers to 40 in a few years, thus placing the nation in the position of an exporter and raising the wealth production to the 11-figure notch.

BROWNSVILLE CITIZENS DESIRE EARLIER TRAINS

Brownsville, Ore., Jan. 10.—At a meeting of the Commercial Club of this city Wednesday evening resolutions were passed condemning the present train service between Brownsville and Albany. A committee was appointed to draft resolutions to present to the Southern Pacific officials asking for a better service. Under the present schedule produce shipped from this place to Portland will not reach Albany in time to make connection with the early train to Portland, and consequently does not reach the latter place in time to be delivered the same day it is shipped. This feature is causing Brownsville to lose trade and the dealers here are up in arms. It is hoped a change bettering conditions will be effected before the warm weather sets in, else most perishable goods will be taken to Halsey for shipment.
