SPRINGFIELD CITY RECORDER AND MARSHAL QUIT THEIR OFFICES

Council At Meeting Monday Night Appoints Their Successors

City offices may hold plenty of honor but they mean sometimes a whole lot of pure hard work that is anything but fun and for which the pay is often but little more than abuse or lack of appreciation, say two of Springfield's officials, J. Newton Rhodes and C. W. Lyons, the newly elected city recorder and appointed city marshal, respectively, whose resignations were received by the city council at the regular session Monday evening. Both of these resignations are a surprise to many. Mr. Rhodes, who was elected by a large majority, has found that to handle his office in the manner that it should be it takes more of his time than he can spare from his business and rather than do the work any other way has found it necessary to give up the non-lucrative position. It is to be regretted, for he would have served the position in a very satisfactory way to every one. He leaves for his successor a carefully prepared set of books.

At Monday's session Mayor Sutton appointed in his place L. E. Thompson, who held this office several years ago. This action, however, was objected to by one councilman who declared that any office that is not originally nominated by the mayor must be filled by the whole council. City Attorney Ness was not prepared to decide the question, so it was agreed that the appointment of Thompson hold good until the next meeting which will be held Friday evening.

To fill the place of city marshal Mayor Sutton appointed Fred Kahler who will take up the duties at once. Mr. Kahler is well known in Springfield.

Routine Business.
At the meeting, at which were present Mayor Sutton and Councilmen Kestley, Rivett, and Lepley, Machen, absent, much routine business was disposed of. A petition was presented by Lepley for a new sidewalk from Main street to Lepley's corner on the west side of Fifth street that was signed by 17 of the property owners. This was ordered built by the council who also gave directions to the street committee to build other sidewalks where they considered necessary.

Rivett asked for are light to be placed on the corner of Mill and D streets. This was voted upon and ordered.

Upon motion of Kestley, the part of Mill street extending in the new addition of the Springfield Realty Company beyond the bridge was ordered vacated.

A motion to place the city recorder upon a flat salary was laid on the table because its legality was questioned. At present the recorder receives the sum of \$10 a month in addition to a number of small fees that seldom amount to more than a dollar or two. The object of this motion was to divert these fees into the city treasury.

Big Printing Bill Paid.

The following bills against the city were ordered paid:
H. Cogill, labor, \$73.75. Frank Smithson, labor, \$1.00. Mel Rice, labor, \$4.20. C. W. Lyons, labor and salary, \$82.00. News Printing Co., printing for December, \$105.90. The bill of the Northwestern Corporation was returned for correction.

It seems that company had charged the city \$2.00 per lamp for the strings across Main street. A little humor relieved the monotony of the meeting when the recorder read and presented a bill from the corporation for light and water used by L. M. Beebe, the former recorder. Mr. Beebe explained that he had been accustomed to receive his bill in the same envelope as the city's because, as a result of a difference with the Springfield collector he paid directly to the Eugene office.

A resolution was passed urging the Northwestern Corporation to lay the water mains in the locality of the new sewer system at once, so that the residents of this district may connect up with both at the same time.

A resolution was passed signifying the intention of the council to act with the Commercial club in the efforts to build a dyke around the head of the mill race to prevent another flood in Springfield.

A Dog License But No Tags.

It seems when it comes time for the city marshal to round up the delinquent canine population that he had no way of knowing which dog had his or her tax paid and which had not. It was ordered Monday night, under ordinance No. 133, that the city recorder secure suitable tags at the expense of the city treasury and give one to each person who holds a dog license.

The city treasurer reported that there was on hand the sum of \$4711.60. He was ordered to draw in city warrants to this sum.

COUNTY ROADS DAMAGED BY THE COLD WEATHER

The frost during the recent cold weather has resulted in severe damage amounting to several thousand dollars to all the county roads by breaking up and softening them. The farmers and mail carriers on the rural free delivery routes declare that the county roads are in worse shape than for many years. Roads that have always been hard and considered good are now almost impassable. When the water in the highways froze the expansion raised the surface in an irregular manner several inches. When they thawed this became very soft and was quickly cut up. This will mean the annoyance of an unusual amount of dust in the dry season.

NO MAIL CARRIER TO AND FROM DEPOT

Monday morning Postmaster Washburne discovered that he had no one to carry the mail from the depot, for the resignation of Winfield & Co. was filed thirty days ago, which is the required time of notice, and the bids or applications sent to Washington have not yet been returned. However, he on his own authority secured a temporary substitute in Howard Bosserman.

BACK TO SPRINGFIELD FROM ALBERTA COUNTRY
