HILL PURCHASES COOS BAY INTERESTS

Claimed That Southern Pacific Rival Has Secured an Entrance

Within 60 days the Northern Pacific Railroad company will have completed the purchase of the holdings of the Oregon Coal & Navigation company on Coos bay, contiguous to Marshfield. This information is given to The Journal upon best authority.

The Oregon Coal & Navigation company owns 3000 acres on Coos bay and the steamer plant, which runs between Coos bay and San Francisco. The company's property consists principally of coal lands. The company also owns valuable water frontage at Marshfield.

By its purchase the Northern Pacific (James J. Hill) acquires entry into Marshfield over what is termed the Boise-Roseburg survey. This survey, engineers claim, does not exceed a 3 per cent grade between Roseburg and Marshfield.

One of the firm of Porter Bros., The Journal is further informed, will visit Coos bay within 30 days to investigate conditions before the purchase is completed.

ANOTHER TRAGEDY IN JOSEPHINE

Grand Pass, Jan. 13.—Another murder has been added to Josephine County's long list. Yesterday afternoon James McGuire shot and killed Angus Knappa following a dispute over a copper prospect on the Illinois river, about 40 miles from this city.

The first news came from McGuire, who telephoned in to the Sheriff as to what he had done and then came in this morning and gave himself up. His story is that Knappa was attempting to jump his claim and was making threats against his life, and that while he was going down to his mine yesterday he noticed Knappa skulking off in the brush near the trail.

Thinking his life in danger, he immediately fired with his 25-30 rifle three shots and then came off and left the body.

Both were old men, being over 60 years of age. McGuire has been in shooting scrapes before and bears the reputation of being a bad gun man.
