MELDRUM GETS PARDON TO GIVE HIS TESTIMONY

Portland, Or., July 13.—

By the terms of a full pardon granted by President Taft Tuesday, Henry Meldrum has been restored to citizenship. It was only by virtue of this pardon that Meldrum became a competent witness for the government against Hermann yesterday. Francis J. Heney, special prosecutor for the government, had this knowledge, and realized that unless Meldrum was restored to citizenship, the ex-Surveyor-General would not be a qualified witness for the prosecution. Accordingly before the Hermann case was called, Heney telegraphed Attorney-General Wickersham recommending that the president pardon Meldrum, who recently completed a term at McNeil's island for the part he played in the Oregon land frauds. The following telegram, announcing that the pardon had been granted, was received by Mr. Heney Tuesday and submitted to Hermann's attorneys yesterday when they objected to Meldrum being sworn as a witness.

"Washington, Jan. 11.—Francis J. Heney, Deputy United States Attorney, Portland, Or.: President has today pardoned Henry Meldrum to restore his civil rights. Warrant of pardon will be prepared at once and mailed to you as soon as possible."

HIGH SCHOOL WILL HAVE OVER 500 STUDENTS AT BEGINNING OF SEMESTER

Over 500 is the registration expected at the Eugene High school at the beginning of the spring semester. The present number attending the school is now 440, and between 60 and 70 are known that will graduate from the eighth grade who will enter in February. This will be more than the seating capacity of the assembly room, which was enlarged only a year ago to almost twice its original size, and Professor Canning will have to take his commercial students in separate rooms. The enrollment has doubled in nearly two years.

TRIANGULAR DEBATE BETWEEN SALEM, ALBANY AND EUGENE

Salem vs. Eugene at Eugene. Interest among the students at the High school is running high, as Friday evening, the time set for the debate, approaches. This is the first debate of the year at the High school and as Eugene's chances for the debate cup hinge on the outcome of this contest, a large attendance of students is assured. The management of this affair hopes that the townspeople will be out in force, as the expense of bringing a team from Salem and the judges, is rather heavy.

The question is, "Resolved, That the United States should establish a banking system similar to that of Canada." The affirmative team of Eugene stays at home. They are: Jesse Kellems, leader; Harold Young, first colleague; Harold Humbert, second colleague. This team debates against Salem's negative team, whose names are not known.

The negative team of Eugene, which goes to Albany, consists of Victor Morris, leader; Bert Lombard, first colleague, and James McCallum, second colleague.

The High school glee club will make its first appearance this year and a decided hit is expected. The orchestra will play a fitting selection. The contest takes place at 7:30 p. m. Friday, January 14, at the High school assembly room.

INCREASE IN RECEIPTS AT DEPOT OVER \$100,000

The increase in the receipts at the Southern Pacific depot in Eugene during the year 1909, was more than \$100,000 over those of the previous year, which is a splendid showing and indicates the rapid growth of the city in that time. The exact figures are not obtainable, but The Guard is informed from a railroad official that they are several thousand dollars higher than \$100,000.

Marshfield, Or., Jan. 13.—The Bandon & Port Orford Railway, which was projected to be built from Bandon down to Port Orford, in Curry County, has been sold to Seattle and Tacoma men, who intend to start actual work early in the Spring.

This announcement was made today by Steve Henderson, who promoted the road and who has just returned from San Francisco, where he closed the deal for the sale.

Mr. Henderson also stated that he was informed by William Hood, chief engineer for the Southern Pacific, that the road from Drain to Coos Bay would be built this Spring.

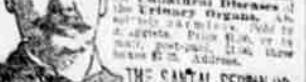
