O. N. G. OFFICERS AT ROSEBURG RESIGN

Captain Slocum and Major Haynes Tender Their Resignation.

Roseburg, Or. Jan. 17.—Marking the close of 15 years of continuous service, Harry C. Slocum has tendered to Adjutant-General Finzer his resignation as captain of Company D, Oregon National Guard of this city. Another resignation sent in from Roseburg is that of Major F. W. Haynes, relinquishing the position of Quartermaster of the Fourth Regiment of the State Guard, which embraces the Roseburg company. Inability to give their military duties the attention they required, because of private business, are the reasons for the resignation of the two officers.

Major Haynes' resignation has been accepted. Captain Slocum's has not, but will be whenever he can turn the property of his company over to the First Lieutenant, F. G. Stewart, who is at present dangerously ill. With the exception of one year spent in Alaska, which compelled severance from military duties for a corresponding period, Major Haynes' career as a civilian soldier has been as long as that of Captain Slocum's. Both donated military uniforms for the first time when the Roseburg company of militia was organized 15 years ago. Both were members of the Second Oregon Regiment which acquitted itself so creditably in the Philippines during the Spanish-American war.

It is learned that J. E. Thornton, Captain of Company B, of Ashland, has also resigned from the service.
